SAFE ARRIVAL SYSTEM

To report your child absent, please use any one of the methods listed below:

- SafeArrival Website: Visit the website at <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create an account using your email address. After logging in, select the Attendance tab to report an absence.
- 2. Personal Mobile Device: Download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store, the Google Play Store, or from the links at <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>. Use your new login information to access your account. Select Attendance to report an absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications directly to your mobile device, please enable Push Notifications in the Settings section of the app. The document titled, <u>SchoolMessenger App Parent & Student User Guide</u> provides instructions for using the app.
- 3. *Standard Telephone*: The toll-free number *1-844-287-6287* will allow you to report your child absent without creating an account.

STUDENT ABSENCES & LATE ARRIVALS

It is essential that all student absences and late arrivals are called into the <u>Safe Arrival Program</u> by <u>8:30 am</u> via phone (1-844-287-6287), website or app. These are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You are also able to input future absences in advance if you are aware of an upcoming appointment or vacation. Board and Ministry policy dictates that we must investigate any unreported absences. This can involve calls to places of employment, the emergency numbers provided to the school and, in some cases, the police.



VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

School visitors continue to be restricted out of an abundance of care and consideration for the health, safety, and privacy of students and school staff. Essential items that must be dropped off are to be labelled clearly and can be placed on the cart to be retrieved by a designated staff member. On behalf of school staff, students, and families, thank you everyone for their ongoing cooperation with this very important matter.

STUDENTS DEMONSTRATING SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS

If a student becomes sick while at school, the identified emergency contact(s) on file will be called for immediate pick up. Parents and guardians of ill children are encouraged to contact Niagara Public Health and follow their advice. *Anyone who is sick should stay at home until their symptoms have resolved for 24 hours (48 hours for gastrointestinal symptoms)*. We thank everyone for their ongoing cooperation regarding this very important health and safety matter.

NUT ANAPHYLAXIS

The entire school community is working hard to prevent accidental exposure to products that trigger lifethreatening reactions. As a result, we continue to maintain a **PEANUT & NUT SAFE environment**. We would appreciate your cooperation in helping us keep St. John Catholic School safe, by making sure your children do not bring foods to school that may contain any traces of **peanuts** or **nuts**.



MILK ANAPHYLAXIS

Due to a number of students in our care who have a severe anaphylactic allergy to milk, it is asked that parents kindly refrain from sending milk to school with their child out of an abundance of care and consideration for the health and safety of these individuals. REMINDERS FOR ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

Kiss n' Ride Drop-Off: In an effort to keep our students and staff members safe, families are reminded that when using the Kiss n' Ride drop-off, *drivers are asked to please remain in their vehicle* and have child(ren) exit the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk when it is safe to do so. Supervising staff will be present in the parking lot at 9:10 am. Parents are kindly asked to please drop their child(ren) off *between 9:10 and 9:20 am.* We thank you for your support as we strive to welcome our students onto school property in an efficient, yet safe manner.

Kiss n' Ride Pick-Up:

To reduce congestion in the Kiss n' Ride line and along King Street, Kiss n' Ride students will be dismissed from their classrooms at <u>3:25 pm</u>. Parents are asked to please be at the school in a timely manner so students can be dismissed efficiently and without causing disruption to the flow of traffic on King Street.

Park & Pick-Up/Drop-Off:

Families of children in car seats who need to park their vehicles and walk their children to the school sidewalk are asked to please be mindful of oncoming traffic, which includes busses and Kiss n' Ride vehicles. For their own safety, families are reminded of the importance of utilizing designated walkways to access the sidewalks. To avoid congestion in the parking lot and to prevent a back-up of vehicles onto King Street, Park & Pick-Up students will be dismissed from their classes at <u>3:25 pm</u>.

The school encourages online payment for all fees and activities for students. It is our goal to be cashless. As part of the Niagara Catholic District School Board, we are committed to providing a safe and efficient online environment in order to reduce the amount of cash and cheques coming into our school. Online payment users benefit from knowing students are not carrying cash to school which can be easily forgotten, misplaced or not handed in on time for important school activities and events. 'SchoolCash' Online is a secure and safe payment portal and is PCI compliant. Please join the many parents who have already registered and are enjoying the convenience of paying online. It takes less than five minutes to register. Please follow the online step-by-step instructions at https://ncdsb.schoolcashonline.com to begin receiving email notifications for events involving your child(ren).

Some of the added benefits enjoyed by using School Cash Online include:

- Having online access to digital receipts and a complete list of paid and unpaid items;
- The ability to pay by credit cards, including Visa, Mastercard, Visa Debit, and Mastercard Debit;
- The ability to preload funds into the School Cash Online wallet for future use;
- Receiving reminder emails, so payment due dates are not missed;
- One-time registration students will automatically be moved between schools within our Board;
- Use of Google Translate in over 100 languages;
- Make an online donation and receive your tax receipt by email for donations \$20 or more;
- Parent Help Desk Support is available 24/7.

HAND WASHING GUIDELINES

- 1. Clean your hands to prevent the spread of germs and reduce your risk of getting sick. Wash your hands after:
 - coughing or sneezing
 - blowing your nose
 - using the washroom
 - playing with pets
 - playing outdoors
 - before preparing meals and eating
- 2. Use warm water and soap; lather and scrub for at least 20 seconds. Have children sing the ABC song, so they scrub for long enough. Alcohol-based sanitizers are safe for children and can be used when no dirt is present on their hands.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM (AP) AT BLESSED TRINITY

What is the Advanced Placement Program (AP)? Students in Advanced Placement courses study topics in greater depth with an opportunity to enhance learning. AP courses in Grade 12 are designed to give students the experience of intro-level post-secondary classes in high school and to provide the possibility of earning postsecondary credits.

What is my child's first step to prepare for the Grade 12 AP Courses?

Students in Grade 9 have the option to select certain Advanced Placement Preparatory (APP) courses. These courses are open to all students who are willing and academically prepared to accept the rigorous academic curriculum. APP courses in grades 9, 10, and 11 prepare students for the Grade 12 AP courses and exams.

The APP courses being offered for Grade 9 students at Blessed Trinity are:

Math - MTH1W AP Prep English - ENL1D AP Prep Science - SNC1D AP Prep Geography - CGC1D AP Prep
