


April Reflection

money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me'" (Mark 10:21).

The Yearbooks will be online until April 17. Don't forget to order. April Food Days were posted last week. Please always remember to check and see if you received an email receipt of your purchases or you can look in your "History" to check as well.

With the nicer weather starting to show her face we also see many students wearing shorts or no jackets outside. Please try to follow the weather networks as the temperatures often shift and we want to make sure students are dressed appropriately for the weather. A light jacket can easily be taken off if it gets too warm but we don't want students scrambling trying to find something warm if the weather turns. Also, when the field firms up we will be allowing students onto the field. A change of indoor shoes will help to keep the dirt and mud out of the classrooms.

Once again, we will be hosting our Scholastic Book Fair in the library. Students will have an opportunity to preview items and bring home a wish list. Please remember that this is just a wish list of items your child(ren) has pointed out. It is your decision as to what you decide to purchase. We will also set aside time for parents to come after school on Tuesday, April 8 from 2:50-3:30 pm to come in and make purchases. Parents can also make credit card purchases at that time.

Tuesday is April Fool's Day. We all like a good prank from time to time, let's just remember to keep them in the realm of appropriateness and safety. We also recognize World Autism Day on Wednesday, April 2, 2025. Students are encouraged to wear blue. It can be any shade of blue. Also, on Wednesday, Father Randy will be back hearing confessions of those students in Mrs. Gerden/Miss Khnanisho and Miss Muracco's classes who wish to participate. We welcome Father Randy back on Thursday to celebrate mass with us in our gym. Lastly, on Friday, we have a PD Day. There is no school for students on that day but the YMCA Daycare will be open.

A reminder email was sent out to families that are still on the Order for Suspension from Attendance at School list. The deadline to respond to this directive is approaching quickly. If you have not yet contacted Niagara Region Public Health, please do so in order to avoid receiving the suspension from school notice. The instructions are in the email sent home as well as the letter mailed to you from Public Health.

We would also like to once again bring to your attention a few clerical concerns. SchoolCashOnline and SchoolMessenger are important tools made available to you to make communication easier for you and the office. SchoolMessenger allows you to report absences and provides us with important information regarding late arrivals, early departures and general attendance concerns. Using this tool helps save the office countless hours of administrative work. If you do not use it to inform us of absences then please answer the calls generated by the attendance system and select the correct response. This will help us immensely. SchoolCashOnline is also very helpful as it alleviated the amount of time spent performing accounting tasks. It is also strongly encouraged because it helps you to track any purchases you have made. It is also used as a permission/consent system. If you need any help please come into

the office and one of us will be able to get you set up. This is going to be the way we will be handling attendance and finance matters moving forward so let us help you get settled.

Lastly, we feel it is important to once again remind everyone of the importance of practicing patience and caution when using our parking lot. We know that it gets a bit busy at the end of the day due to everyone arriving at around the same time. Please remember to be cautious and look for those walking across the parking lot, especially smaller children who may be more difficult to see. Be careful when changing lanes and reduce your speed. The lot empties out quickly so please be patient and work with us.




