





April Reflection:

In Mark's Gospel, we read about Jesus and the rich man, who asked what he had to do to inherit eternal life. The rich man explained that he had kept all the commandments, but "Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, 'You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me" (Mark 10:21). The rich man chose not to follow Jesus because he loved his many possessions. Our hearts were made for God. In order to follow Jesus, we need to set aside the things that take His place in our hearts. Jesus wants to be the King of our whole heart, not just part of it. Like his call to the rich man, Jesus asks each of us to let go of every-thing that gets in the way of us following Him. Take a moment today to pray and ask Jesus to reveal any areas of your heart that need His healing touch and to help you fully entrust them to Him. By identifying and surrendering these parts of our hearts, we allow Jesus to transform us from within.

With the changing of seasons, spring reminds us that there is very little time left in the school year, with still so many things to do and learn, and so many accomplishments to celebrate. Our faith and learning journey is renewed in the optimism that comes with spring blooms and growth.

As March came to an end we continued to focus on helping children live their faith with the same open arms of Christ during the Lenten season. As a school community, we will prepare for Easter by doing good deeds and practicing our faith more deeply. Throughout the weeks leading to Easter and especially during Holy Week, many of our Catholic traditions come to life: the Lord's Supper and the washing of the disciples feet on Holy Thursday; Stations of the Cross on Good Friday; celebrating the Lord's Resurrection at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday; and a communal Eucharistic Celebration of the Lord's Resurrection on Easter Sunday. As a school family we continue to strengthen our relationship with Jesus, through prayer, almsgiving and sacrifice. Thank you to our two, three, five and six students, and to Ms. Perry and Ms. Hay, for leading us in prayer and reflection through the Stations of the Cross, sharing in the sorrow and joy of Jesus' journey, and His gift to all of us, everlasting life.
