#### **School Ground Clean Up**

School grounds and community clean up events make a difference. These actions, although small, have significant positive impacts on the environment and demonstrate the power of working together.

Mary Ward students will be participating in a School Grounds Clean Up campaign on April 22nd to demonstrate our commitment to creating a healthy and sustainable world.

Teachers will take their students outdoors to pick up litter on the school grounds. Students will be provided with gloves and bags. Students will be informed of safe and proper procedures for collecting and disposing of litter.

#### **Gently Used Clothing Drive**

Did you know that the clothing industry creates <u>2.1 billion tonnes of carbon emissions</u> globally each year? It also uses 342 million barrels of oil a year to make our synthetic clothes.

Much of the plastic waste in our landfill comes from our synthetic clothes. In Canada, each household throws away an average of 81 lbs of textiles per year, making up for 10% of municipal landfills.

Mary Ward families are encouraged to help take action to divert textile waste by donating gently used clothes beginning April 22 - 25, 2025.

All clothes collected will be donated to The Diabetes Association. Donations will be accepted at the main office of the school.
