The Niagara Region Public Health Dental Program offers **FREE** dental clinics for children and youth 17 and under throughout Niagara.





All of our dental clinics offer free dental assessments, cleanings, fluoride and sealants. To book an appointment contact the Dental Progra or book a dental assessment online


Let’s Talk Vaping
