SPORTS NEWS



Today, multiple classes and members of LCHS Students' Council opened the *Jubilee 2000 Time Capsule*. This Time Capsule was created on December 23, 1999 at the turn of the century – many would remember this date as Y2K! Pope John Paul II commemorated Jubilee 2000 as a special period of celebration and spiritual renewal, marked by a theme and the opening of the Holy Doors in Rome, encouraging pilgrimage and forgiveness. Today, as a school community, we marked this special date by highlighting our new Holy Year, Jubilee 2025, with it's theme "Pilgrims of Hope." We shared the history of the Jubilee 2000 Wall where all staff and students from the 1999-2000 school year signed one brick on this wall, in addition to the time capsule. As we celebrate Jubilee 2025, members of our school community will be creating a new Catholicity Wall in this space where we will capture memories from both Holy Years, along with Catholic commitments to our Witness through expressions of our Catholic Social Teachings and Catholic Graduate Expectations. The contents within the Time Capsule will be on display in the chapel until the end of this school year; guests are invited to come see the contents if they so choose. Our new Catholicity Wall will be completed for the start of May 2025, Catholic Education Week – during that week, we will also be celebrating mass honouring Jubilee 2025.

The Niagara Catholic Parent Involvement Committee (NCPIC) supports the Mission of Catholic education and the Mission, Vision and Values of the Niagara Catholic District School Board by providing a communication link to parents/guardians, Catholic School Councils, the Diocese, the Director of Education, and the Board. The NCPIC promotes active parent/guardian engagement within all schools for the improvement of student achievement and well-being of all students in the Niagara Catholic District School Board.

The NCPIC membership is made up of parents/guardians, community and student representatives, the Bishop of the Diocese of St. Catharines or his appointed representative, principals, teachers, support staff, the Director of Education or designate, the appointed Superintendent of Education and Trustees. The Niagara Catholic Parent Involvement Committee meets on the first Thursday of the month, on a bi-monthly basis (or as noted) at the Catholic Education Centre from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Meetings are open to the public, livestreamed and recorded.
