








May Reflection

Catholic Education Week - 2025

This year's Catholic Education Week theme is, "Pilgrims of Hope." The theme for Catholic Education Week 2025 was inspired by the following considerations:



CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK MAY 4 - MAY 9, 2025

- In February of 2022, Pope Francis announced that the theme for the upcoming 2025 holy year would be "Pilgrims of Hope." "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given to us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. - The Holy Father asks us to focus prayerfully on the bonds that unite our whole human family, to reflect on the rampant poverty in our world, and to think about the plight of the many refugees forced to leave their homes. He also summons us, as stewards of Creation, "to contemplate the beauty of creation and care for our common home."
- A pilgrimage is a spiritual journey of movement toward a goal, often lived together with others

 and that certainly describes Catholic education. Hope one of the three theological virtues
 is grounded in our Easter faith in Jesus' resurrection and renewal; this is what enables us to be builders, dreamers and leaders in Jesus' name. Pope Francis invites us to keep moving ahead in faith, in joy, and in hope, as part of a pilgrim people. Even in challenging times, our eyes are focussed on the future.

There are five sub-themes for each day of Catholic Education Week:

- Day 1: By honouring human dignity / Honorent la dignité humaine
- Day 2: By caring for creation / Prennent soin de la création
- Day 3: By responding to the poverties in our world / Luttent contre les pauvretés
- Day 4: By serving in solidarity / Servent en solidarité
- Day 5: By living as peacemakers / Vivent en artisans de paix

Every year, the Ontario Catholic School Trustees' Association (OCSTA) provides our Catholic schools with a resource kit to help schools prepare for Catholic Education Week. Using these resources, as well as our own developed activities, we have prepared a series of activities, which will highlight how the students and staff at our school are being *Pilgrims of Hope* together.

Lice Management

How do I get rid of all of the eggs?

Removing eggs after the treatment can end your head lice problems. Start by using a fine-tooth comb. Then remove the smaller eggs by hand.

- Sit under a bright light or in sunlight
- > Have your child watch television, a video or read to keep still. Work for 10-15 minutes at a time.
- Work with a small section of wet hair (clip the rest out of the way)
- > Comb the smaller eggs off the hair strands using your thumbnail and fingernail.
- Continue section by section until you remove <u>all</u> the eggs.

Check the hair 2 times a week for 4 weeks to make sure all the eggs have been removed.

Do I need to wash or clean anything else?

Soak combs, brushes in hot water and head lice product for 5 - 10 minutes. Wash clothes, hats, towels and bedding used in the past three days, in hot soapy water and dry in a dryer for 20 minutes after the first and second treatment. Vacuuming is helpful, but special sprays are not needed on furniture or floors. Lice live only a short time away from the head.

Lunch Delivery

We do not order extras and will not have additional food in case your child doesn't have a lunch. We do always have additional items in our snack bins and we will do our



best to provide food if they cannot contact you. Please review the new student Nutrition Break times.



Please remember to report your child's absence using the **SAFEARRIVAL** portal. With the office being a very busy place, you can also put in an **EARLY DEPARTURE**. This will allow us to have your child ready and at the office for the time you have selected.
