1. Kids Helping Kids Novelty Cheque Presentation

Chair Di Lorenzo introduced Gino Pizzoferrato, Superintendent of Education who provided background information on the Niagara Catholic's 2026 Kids Helping Kids Campaign which raised funds for the Niagara Children's Centre and the Niagara Foundation for Catholic Education. The campaign successfully raised a total of \$40,795.60.

Director Cipriano and Chair Di Lorenzo presented Noella Klawitter Chief Executive Officer of Niagara Children's Centre and Pam Sharpe Director of Development of Niagara Children's Centre with a cheque for \$20,397.80.

Ms. Klawitter addressed the Board and expressed her gratitude for the Niagara Catholic Partnership not only through fundraising, but through collaboration, advocacy, and shared commitment to helping children reach their full potential. Kids Helping Kids is more than fundraising it helps shape compassionate, empathetic students who support children in their own community. She highlighted the long-standing 28-year partnership with Niagara Catholic, which has raised nearly \$900,000 and fostered a culture of kindness, inclusion, and generosity. Ms. Klawitter thanked the students, staff, and community for their ongoing support in helping children and inspiring future compassionate leaders.

REPORT TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES JUNE 16, 2026

MATH ACHIEVEMENT ACTION PLAN 2025-2026 FINAL REPORT

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Ministry of Education launched Ontario’s Math Achievement Action Plan during the 2023-2024 school year to support student achievement and results in math across the province. The ministry brought together experts in mathematics education to better understand the next steps for math improvement in Ontario. Through this work, the ministry developed *Taking Action in Mathematics* (Appendix A), an iterative framework to capture areas of focus and guide improvement actions.

Math Achievement Action Plan

Informed by the ministry’s *Taking Action in Mathematics* framework, the Board Math Lead, along with the Math Facilitators developed a board Math Achievement Action Plan, which included three sections:

- All schools report to provide board-wide improvement efforts and results in mathematics
- Priority Schools report to provide intensive improvement efforts
- Priority Schools Provincial KPI (Key Performance Indicators) report to provide intentional monitoring of student achievement KPI’s common to all priority schools across the province.

The Math Achievement Action Plan outlines the board’s concrete, visible, and measurable strategies as well as key performance indicators at the board, school, and classroom level under the four areas of focus:

1. Curriculum Fidelity
2. Math Content Knowledge for Teaching
3. Knowing Your Student
4. Measurable Results: Improvements in Math Achievement

The Math Achievement Action Plan is to be endorsed by the Director and trustees of the board and will be submitted to the ministry under the following timelines:

- November 14, 2025 (Initial): Initial strategies and KPI’s
- March 27, 2026 (Progress): Incorporate data from Term 1/Semester 1
- July 17, 2026 (Final): Incorporate data from Term 2/Semester 2

All schools continue to engage in the work of their Math Achievement Action Plans.

- EQAO results for the Primary and Junior Assessment of Mathematics continue to show a trend towards a positive increase in student achievement, surpassing the Provincial results by a


significant amount. The Grade 9 EQAO Mathematics results also show a positive trend, slightly above Provincial results.

- All staff Kindergarten – Grade 8 received job-embedded Literacy and Numeracy Professional Learning during Chaplaincy Visits through the year targeting the three priority actions identified by the Ministry. Grade 3-8 Educators focused on the components of a comprehensive math program during their professional learning sessions that helped to relate curriculum expectations to instruction and assessment practices and the use of mathematics resources to support student learning.
- Grades 3 and/or 6 educators at Priority schools received weekly in-classroom support and professional development from the Board Math Facilitators (Math Consultant and Math Coaches) throughout the school year.
- Professional learning related to the Ministry’s Priority Actions has been included in Elementary and Secondary PA Days.
- Educators in Kindergarten to Grade 10 continue to engage in the work of Short Learning Cycles. This targeted work has extensive research to back that short, targeted instruction connected to specific student gaps in understanding are linked to closing gaps and moving students along in their understanding.
- Principals continued to participate in Principal Learning Teams concentrating on leading math learning in their schools.
- Kindergarten and Designated Early Childhood Educators participated in two full days of release to prepare them for the updated Kindergarten Curriculum that will be implemented in September 2026. A significant portion of these days was focused on Mathematics and the great importance of early math concepts to the future success of mathematical learning and understanding for students. Early math experienced in Kindergarten is a good predictor of future success down the road.
- Positive feedback from the Ministry of Education on the submitted Math Achievement Action Plan and data, specifically the progress that has been identified in relation to the Key Performance Indicators which link observable student outcomes/progress to the educator knowledge and actions.

Teacher and Student Engagement

Students in Kindergarten to Grade 10 have access to Knowledgehook, one of the Board’s selected digital math tools. While the tool serves a variety of purposes for the educators, including diagnostic and formative assessment, as well as supporting educator content knowledge for teaching mathematics, it also provides opportunities for students to engage in math questions that are directly related to the Ontario Curriculum.

Appendix A:

Taking action in mathematics | Look-fors by provincial action

Math achievement efforts across the province should include multiple proven evidence-informed strategies and approaches to address local learning needs in schools.

The ministry has worked with researchers, math specialists, and school boards to identify three interwoven math actions to be prioritized in the 2023-24 school year. Board Math Leads, as they determine board and school priorities in mathematics achievement, will develop, implement, and monitor a Math Achievement Action Plan that includes meaningful and measurable key performance indicators (KPIs) aligned with each of the priority actions below.

A mathematics community of excellence: In order to promote effective math instruction, it is important for educators to foster mathematics communities in classrooms and schools, and to recognize that not all students learn math in the same way or within the same time frames. Effective math instruction is supported by an inclusive, positive, and safe learning environment where all students feel valued and engaged, and in which educators clearly communicate expectations and establish norms and routines with their students at the beginning of instruction. Educators at all levels of the school system have a role to play in establishing a culture of excellence in mathematics and setting conditions for success. This includes leaders reviewing practices to determine barriers to success, creating accountability, and attending to mathematics attitudes and mindsets in school and system improvement plans.
