THAT the following recommendations by Senior Staff as provided in the *Senior Staff Follow-Up Report and Recommendations on Pupil Accommodation Review for Niagara Falls Elementary, St. Catharines Elementary and St. Catharines Secondary* be received and considered for approval at the May 26th, 2009 Board Meeting;

- 1. THAT, St. Joseph Catholic Elementary School be closed by September 2010 with St. Joseph students relocated through the Attendance Area process to St. Mary, St. Patrick and Father Hennepin Catholic Elementary Schools.
 - 2. THAT, no sooner than September 2012 and subject to Ministry of Education funding and approval for a new school in the Warren Woods Estate and for an addition and renovations to Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Elementary School, the closure of St. Thomas More Catholic Elementary School with the students relocated to Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Elementary School.
 - 3. THAT, over the next five years Senior Staff will monitor student population growth, projections, location and accommodation data in the southern portion of the City of Niagara Falls and if required, apply to the Ministry of Education for capital funding for a new elementary school in the Warren Woods Estate of Niagara Falls.
 - 4. THAT, a Niagara Falls Elementary and Secondary Ad Hoc Attendance Area Review Committee of the Board be established in September 2009 to review the attendance boundaries for all elementary and secondary schools in Niagara Falls. According to the Board's Attendance Area Policy 301.3, the mandate of the committee will be to recommend to the Board stability within all attendance areas while maximizing facility utilization of all elementary and secondary schools in Niagara Falls.
 - 5. THAT, Senior Staff will continue to monitor the possibility of closing Michael J. Brennan Catholic Elementary School and that Senior Staff will bring a report to the Board no later than September 2012.

- 6. THAT, Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Elementary School not be consolidated at this time subject to the Ad Hoc Attendance Area Review process and recommendations and that Senior Staff continues to monitor enrolment and report back to the Board no later than September 2012.
- 7. THAT, no later than September 2012, the closure of St. Nicholas Catholic Elementary School with students relocated through the Attendance Area process to Mother Teresa, St. Alfred, St. Anthony, St. Christopher and St. Denis Catholic Elementary Schools unless an approved joint venture is confirmed between the Niagara Catholic District School Board and a coterminous District School Board, with the City of St. Catharines to provide confirmed property in the downtown core, and the Ministry of Education to provide confirmed funding and approval for a new downtown elementary school.
- 8. THAT, a St. Catharines Elementary and Secondary Ad Hoc Attendance Area Review Committee of the Board be established in September 2009 to review the attendance boundaries for all elementary and secondary schools in St. Catharines. According to the Board's Attendance Area Policy 301.3, the mandate of the committee will be to recommend to the Board stability within all attendance areas while maximizing facility utilization of all elementary and secondary schools in St. Catharines.
- 9. THAT, the Board maintains all three Catholic secondary schools in St. Catharines and monitors the accommodation and utilization of all three Catholic secondary school facilities over the next five years.
- 10. THAT, Senior Staff will continue to apply to the Ministry of Education for additional funding and to identify other sources of funding in order to provide facility plant upgrades to St. Francis Catholic Secondary School.
- 11. THAT, Catholic Secondary Schools in St. Catharines will continue to have the opportunity to implement specialized programs providing sufficient student enrolment and Ministry of Education funding and approval.

Who We Are

In September of 1952, Notre Dame Elementary School opened its doors to answer the need for a Roman Catholic School in the Stamford area of Niagara Falls. It consisted of only 2 classrooms; Grades 1 to 3 taught by Mother Mary Judith Deek and Grades 4 to 7 taught by Sister Viola Ireland who was also the founding Principal.

Following the first year in 1952, two more rooms were added in 1953 and another two in 1954. The final amalgamation of the boards in Stamford took place January 1, 1959, and was then known as Stamford Roman Catholic Union Separate School Board. The final addition took place in 1967, with the addition of 5 more classrooms, a library and a gymnasium.

- ♦ Total enrolment: 220 students as of September 2008
- Our staff includes a Principal, 10 classroom teachers, 1 educational resource teacher, a .35 E.S.L. teacher, 1.54 French teachers, 1 library technician, 1 child and youth care worker and 5 full time educational assistants, and 1 half time educational assistant.
- Our lives at school are further enriched through the involvement and support provided by the St. Paul Secondary School community – staff and students.



EQAO Primary Assessment of Reading, Writing and Mathematics

The Niagara Catholic District School Board is celebrating student achievement after province-wide test results showed its Grade 3 students have exceeded the provincial averages in Reading, Writing and Mathematics, once again. In May of 2008 the EQAO Primary Assessment of Reading, Writing and Mathematics was administered across elementary schools in our board. Achievement is described in four levels, where Level 3 is the provincial standard. The EQAO reported the results of school, board and provincial achievement by two methods: Method 1 includes all Grade 3 students and Method 2 includes Grade 3 students excluding students who were exempted or did not complete any work during the assessment. The Niagara Catholic District School Board's commitment to quality Catholic education and to the success and achievement of each individual child entrusted to its care was demonstrated by the fact that 98% of Grade 3 students participated in the Provincial Assessment

Primary Assessment Results



Levels 3, 4

- 81% of all students at Notre Dame School achieved levels 3, 4 in reading.
- 69% of the students across the Niagara Catholic District School Board and 61% across the province attained this level.

Levels 2, 3, 4

- 100% of all students at Notre Dame School achieved levels 2, 3, 4 in reading.
- 94% of the students across the Niagara Catholic District School Board and 87% across the province attained this level.

Levels 3, 4

- 81% of all students at Notre Dame School achieved levels 3, 4 in writing.
- 76% of the students across the Niagara Catholic District School Board and 66% across the province attained this level.

Levels 2, 3, 4

- 100% of all students at Notre Dame School achieved levels 2, 3, 4 in writing.
- 99% of the students across the Niagara Catholic District School Board and 95% across the province attained this level.

Levels 3, 4

- 100% of all students at Notre Dame School achieved levels 3, 4 in mathematics.
- 75% of the students across the Niagara Catholic District School Board and 68% across the province attained this level.

Levels 2, 3, 4


- 100% of all students at Notre Dame School achieved levels 2, 3, 4 in mathematics.

The EQAO reported the results of school, board and provincial achievement by two methods: Method 1 includes all Grade 6 students and Method 2 includes Grade 6 students excluding students who were exempted or did not complete any work during the assessment. The Niagara Catholic District School Board's commitment to quality Catholic education and to the success and achievement of each individual child entrusted to its care was demonstrated by the fact that 98% of Grade 6 students participated in the Provincial Assessment

If required, adjustments will be made to the individual plans to reflect the needs of our students and school communities.

SMART stands for goals that are S – Specific, M – Measurable, A – Attainable, R – Relevant, T – Time Based.

REPORT ON REVISED TRANSPORTATION POLICY

DIRECTION FROM POLICY COMMITTEE

The Revised Transportation Policy was presented to the Policy Committee meeting of April 8, 2009. The Policy Committee agreed that the revised Transportation Policy would be presented directly to the April Board Meeting because of the time that would be required to effect the required changes in student transportation for September 2009, should be revised policy be approved by the Board. It was also agreed that the revised policy would undergo a limited vetting process. The vetting took place from April $4^{th} - 22^{nd}$ throughout the system, with no further input received.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In 2006, the Ministry of Education requested that all school boards establish a Transportation Consortium with their coterminous boards, in order to achieve the following objectives:

- 1. Improve the capacity to deliver safe, effective and efficient student transportation services
- 2. Achieve greater equity in funding allocations for all school boards
- 3. Reduce the administrative costs related to transportation
- 4. Allow school boards to focus on student learning and achievement.

The Ministry informed all school boards that an Efficiency and Effectiveness (E & E) Review Team would evaluate the operations of each consortium every three years. After each E&E Review, the Ministry will rate each consortium on a scale of zero to one hundred percent, as follows:

- A high ranking will reduce the transportation deficit by 100%
- A moderate-high ranking will reduce the transportation deficit by 90%
- A moderate ranking will reduce the transportation deficit by 60%
- A moderate-low ranking will reduce the transportation deficit by 30%
- A low ranking will reduce the transportation deficit by 0% to 30%

Based on the rating received by the consortium, the Ministry will approve a proportional reduction of the transportation deficit of the participating boards.

In November 2006, the District School Board of Niagara (DSBN) and the Niagara Catholic District School Board (Niagara Catholic) established the Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) Consortium with the mandate to provide safe, efficient and effective student transportation services. The Ministry has determined that NSTS will be reviewed by the Efficiency and Effectiveness (E&E) Review Team in October 2009.

In October 2008, the Ministry Capacity Building Team visited the NSTS Consortium, in order to provide NSTS Staff with valuable information that can be used to prepare for the E&E Review. After the Capacity Building visit, the Ministry of Education issued a report and made recommendations that are designed to improve the efficient and effective administration and operations of the consortium.

It is important to note that the report included a recommendation regarding the need to develop of a harmonized Transportation Policy, in order to enable NSTS to provide transportation services on a single entity basis.

At the present time, the Transportation Policies of Niagara Catholic and DSBN are similar. However, they use slightly different phraseology and they have different walking distances for elementary students in Grade 1 to 8, as follows:

<u>Grades</u>	DSBN (km)	Niagara Catholic B (km)
JK – SK	0.80	0.80
1-8	1.60	1.50
9-12	2.50	2.50

A survey of the walking distances approved by other schools boards indicates that the majority of school boards use a walking distance of 1.6 km for elementary students in Grades 1 to 8.

NSTS has completed a review of the impact of changing the walking distance from 1.5 km to 1.6 km for the elementary students of Niagara Catholic. Based on recognized hazard areas and logical cut-off points, NSTS identified the students who are currently eligible for transportation under the 1.5 km distance and who would not be eligible under the 1.6 km distance.

The review indicated that approximately 100 students would be deemed not eligible for transportation, if Niagara Catholic changed the Grade 1-8 eligibility criteria from 1.5 km to 1.6 km.

It is important to note that, by harmonizing the current Transportation Policies into one single Transportation Policy, NSTS is expected to receive a higher rating by the E & E Review Team, which could result in additional revenue for the Board.

We recommend that the Niagara Catholic District School Board approve the proposed revised Transportation Policy, which is the same as the policy that will be recommended for approval to the District School Board of Niagara. At this time, no changes to the Administrative Guidelines are being recommended.

Niagara Catholic District School Board STUDENT TRANSPORTATION POLICY

Adopted: March 27, 2007 Policy No. 500.2

Revised:

STATEMENT OF POLICY

In accordance with the *Education Act*, school boards may provide home-to-school or school-to-school transportation to their students who are within the Board's jurisdiction or control. In all cases (other than those situations specified in the *Education Act*), transportation is a privilege, not a right, and it may be withdrawn at any time.

Eligibility

 Transportation may be provided for elementary and secondary school students when the walking distance from the student's residence to their home school is equal to or greater than the distance listed below:

GRADE LEVEL	KILOMETRES
Junior Kindergarten - Senior Kindergarten	.80
Grades 1- 8	1.60
Grades 9 – 12	2.50

- 2. All distances referenced shall be the shortest walking route, measured from the point at which the laneway or driveway of the student's residence joins the roadway to the nearest roadway or pathway/sidewalk entrance to the school property.
- 3. The distance from a student's residence to the bus pickup or discharge location shall not exceed the transportation eligibility distances.
- 4. Where a student encounters safety hazards on his/her walk to school, consideration may be given to providing appropriate transportation for the student.
- 5. Transportation may be provided to students with exceptional needs, with the approval from the authorized department.
- 6. Transportation may be provided to students, who attend a school other than their home school for approved program attendance, with the approval from the authorized department.
- 7. Every effort will be made to keep student transportation time from home to school at a reasonable level. Whenever possible and practical, the transportation time is not expected to exceed one hour.

The Director of Education, in consultation with the Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) Consortium, will issue Administrative Guidelines in conjunction with this policy.

Results of site visit to Niagara Student Transportation Services

Introduction

The following memorandum summarizes the results of a capacity building visit to the Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) consortium serving the District School Board of Niagara (DSBN) and the Niagara Catholic District School Board (NCDSB). The goal of the visit was to provide the Consortium with information to guide its development of a full consortia meeting the expectations of an Effectiveness and Efficiency (E&E) review. Interviews were conducted with consortium and Board staff to allow the capacity building team to gain an understanding of the consortia development status, cooperation between partner boards, operational policies, practices, and procedures. Also, a selection of data was extracted to calculate related performance statistics and indicators in order to understand both system reporting capabilities and operational performance.

As the capacity building visit is not intended to be a substitute or proxy for the full E&E review, this visit did not address all areas included in the E&E process. Previous E&E review reports (available @ https://transport.edu.gov.on.ca/.) describe the E&E review process and the E&E requirements in more detail.

Results of the Capacity Building Visit

Consortium Management

The review of Consortium Management focused on the relationship structure between each of the Boards and the decision making processes that influence the provision of transportation services. The recommendations are listed below.

- Establishing NSTS as a legal entity with a defined Board of Directors is consistent with best practice expectations of the E&E process. The goal of providing independence to the consortium in order to allow it to provide unbiased advice free of any influence from either Partner Board is a key expectation of the E&E process. Use of an incorporated legal entity is the ultimate manifestation of this expectation.
 - The structure of the legal entity established by the Boards provides for a defined Board of Directors with equal representation from each Partner Board. Given that the objective of the Consortium is to be the implementer of service expectations



established by the Boards, the need for equal representation is an important component of the overall governance structure. Under this approach, the Boards are able to define the expected levels of service required to deliver the educational programs they desire and solicit input and advice from the Consortium on the cost and service impacts of those service requirements. This structure allows the Consortium to support the Boards in the delivery of educational services without determining for the Boards what services they can and cannot provide.

- o Proper governance procedures require that the proceedings of the Board of Directors meetings be documented in the form of formal meeting minutes. The accuracy of these minutes should be verified and affirmed via a signature of the Board Secretary.
- o Acquisition of professional liability insurance for NSTS is a sound risk management strategy and consistent with best practice expectations of the E&E.
- The use of unweighted students as a method to allocate costs is consistent with practices across the Province. Specific consideration should be given to the impact that a lack of proportionality of otherwise ineligible students may have on the sharing of costs.
- Establishment of an off site location for the Consortium is a positive step towards encouraging the independence and cohesion of Consortium staff. Allowing this culture to form in an environment that encourages the establishment of a single organizational identity without unbalanced influence from any Partner Board will assist in ensuring the delivery of effective and efficient service.
- Consider the establishment of a detailed strategic and operational plan for the continued evolution of NSTS. The use of an annual or multi-year strategic planning document that is an outgrowth of collaboration between NSTS and the Board of Directors provides a useful resource and reference point to staff as NSTS continues to form into a cohesive, single unit. This process can assist in the resolution and establishment of both internal and external best practices by soliciting input from staff on critical tasks. Additionally, the annual review of objectives and accomplishment provide a consistent point of comparison through which organizational and staff performance can be evaluated.
 - o A major component of this plan will be to reconcile the job expectations of each individual employee. This reconciliation will ensure that any existing confusion or apprehension regarding procedural or operational expectations is minimized if not eliminated.
 - Consideration will also need to be given to the allocation of specific job responsibilities such as responsibility for safety program management, route audit responsibilities, and other cross cutting management and administrative requirements.
- Creating an organizational structure that provides for internal analysis and quality control is a unique and innovative approach to staffing. The NSTS organizational structure



provides for a designated strategic planning structure that will be responsible for special projects and targeted analysis. This approach provides NSTS with the ability to conduct detailed analyses of operational changes without adversely impacting the ability of Transportation Coordinators to adequately oversee their daily management requirements. Given that the full benefit of this structure will not be realized until the vacant Transportation Coordinator position is filled, it is critical to ensure that every effort is made to employ a coordinator for the Niagara area. Given the still formative nature of NSTS and the remaining need to still reconcile policies and operating practices, this capability is likely to be particularly valuable in the immediate and medium term.

NSTS has also structured its organization to effectively manage technology challenges. The separation of application management from general hardware, software, and network can be an effective use of staff time. While this strategy has generally been effective, NSTS should continue to ensure that technical staff are sufficiently cross trained to minimize the negative impact of employee absence or turnover.

Policies and Practices

Policies and Practices represent the primary constraints and operating practices of a transportation program. Recommendations in this area include:

- Develop a single policy document that establishes critical NSTS operating policies and practices as a first step toward full harmonization of transportation policies.
 - Policies established by each Board vary in level of detail and use of administrative procedures, but also share many common characteristics. Combining the existing policy documents into a single statement, while still maintaining the integrity of the current policies for each Board, would constitute a positive step toward full harmonization.
 - o With the combined policy statement as a starting point, begin discussions with the member boards to establish uniform (harmonized) service parameters (eligibility, walk distances to stops and school, courtesy transportation, hazard relief and school calendars) over a mutually agreeable timeline.
- Particular attention should be paid to the establishment of eligibility criteria and management procedures associated with courtesy and hazardous transportation services. Recent events have led to inconsistent application of the criteria that have resulted in a need to revise the routing scheme to accommodate the provision of this service. The E&E review process focuses on the decision making and management of otherwise ineligible students and their impact on routing efficiency. Therefore, consideration should be given to whether the allowance for courtesy students will have a negative impact on overall operation efficiency.



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Routing and Technology

Analysis of Routing and Technology focused on how consortium staff have implemented the routing software and the utilization of the system in daily operations, including the use of basic and advanced system functionality and reporting capabilities. Recommendations include:

- Continue the efforts to improve the timeliness and availability of student data to NSTS. Implementation of the *MapNet* transportation management information system is generally complete, but continuing efforts are required to improve student data availability. Currently, there are substantial differences in the ease of availability of student data between the Boards. Dedicating additional resources to allow NSTS and NCDSB to more easily transfer data while reducing the volume of manual processing that must occur to properly transform the data would greatly improve the completeness and accuracy of the student data in *MapNet*.
 - NSTS staff have been developing a reporting routine that allows schools to be notified of issues with data quality. This is a laudable step to improving the usefulness of student data for planning and reporting.
- Continue to expand the existing Intranet site for use by NSTS staff, school staff and contractors. The dissemination of transportation through web-based technology is a highly efficient and cost effective approach to ensuring that all stakeholders have the most complete and current data available. Currently, NSTS provides production services through the printing of bus route or stop data for schools and bus contractors despite the availability of web-based tools that eliminates the need for this. In order to allow NSTS staff to focus on their primary job of analyzing bus route information for efficiencies.
- Existing backup and data management procedures provide for adequate data protections and timely restoration of system availability in the event of an incident. This is accomplished through a hierarchal backup plan that includes the encryption of all data. However, consideration should be given to the establishment of periodic off site storage of backup tapes in the event of a catastrophic occurring at the NSTS location which would result in the loss of all data under the current procedures.
- Consideration should be given to revising either bell times or route directions in an effort to increasing the use of tiering in order to maximize the use of each asset. Analysis of run data indicates that a majority of runs are providing service on a single tier, indicating that there may be opportunities to reconfigure existing runs to increase the number of pairings. The following table summaries the tiering ratios for the morning and afternoon panels.

- The prevalence of the single tier system is also evident in the analysis of planned capacity use across the tiers. Planned capacity use, defined as the percent of available seats that are actually filled, indicates that across the system the average value is 79 percent. This value is high and consistent with industry best practices. However, it is apparent that this value is driven by the very efficient use of seating capacity on runs that service a single tier and a consistent policy of overloading buses due to expectations about ridership. Approximately 20 percent of all runs are planned with student loads that are greater than 100 percent of available seating capacity. This practice clearly attempts to maximize available seating capacity, a key component of efficiency, through an understanding of historic ridership patterns. Continued analysis of ridership patterns will be required to ensure that adequate seating is available for all eligible riders.
- Analysis of current ride times indicates that the majority of overwhelming majority of students are riding the bus for less than 20 minutes. This may be an indicator that in order to increase efficiency through tiering, and thus improve cost control, effectiveness can be reevaluated by increasing ride lengths. The chart below displays a breakout of student ride times, calculated from pick up time to drop off time, for all morning and afternoon rides.

Consider the implications of the existing bell time windows established in *MapNet*. Currently, there is inconsistency in the arrival windows that may be adversely impacting route timing. For example, high schools within a specific Board have arrival and departure window times that may vary by as much as 10 to 15 minutes. Interviews with staff indicated that the reason for this was to allow the system to more accurately reflect

actual performance at the schools. The concern is that these differences may adversely impact NSTS' ability to evaluate alternative bell schedules or routing schemes consistent with previous recommendations.

Contract Management

Analysis of Contract Management practices included a review of contract status and oversight practices. The following recommendations are related to this area:

- Consider the implications of the lack of a fleet age requirement in the existing service agreement. Given that maintenance costs increase and vehicle reliability generally decreases with an aging fleet, the lack of an age requirement could have a negative impact on both costs and service quality.
- The established fuel adjustment clause is a reasonable approach to mitigating risk on behalf of both NSTS and the bus contractors.
- Establish a formalized business relationship between NSTS staff and its vendors that includes a structured process to govern the operational relationship, including:
 - Use of a contract to guide all discussions between NSTS and each vendor.
 - Use of written addenda to the contract document for all negotiated changes.
 - o Scheduling regular meetings with service providers to review performance standards and outline NSTS compliance monitoring procedures.
- Establish contractual mechanisms for services provided by each of the Boards to ensure the full cost of transportation is established and accounted for. There is no existing charge-back structure to account for the services rendered to NSTS by the Partner Boards. This limits the ability of NSTS management to evaluate the service it receives and determine if the current methods are the most advantageous and cost effective methods to receive services. Specific services to be evaluated include: human resources, accounting, and information technology support.
- Develop a comprehensive route-auditing program that will allow the consortium to ensure that routes are constructed in a manner that meet safety, service delivery, and cost efficiency goals. Elements of the route auditing program should include spot reviews of driver performance, on site observation of operator performance, enhanced reporting requirements, and reconciliation of actual versus planned ridership counts. In addition, this type of program can assist with on going management and evaluation of map data as consistent auditing of route times will help ensure the accuracy of road segment speeds, among other potential benefits.
- Establish a procedure to ensure that all operator contracts are signed prior to the opening of school.

Conclusion

NSTS has implemented a number of practices that are consistent with E&E best practices including the establishment of an incorporated entity housed in an off site location. Additionally, the establishment of a planning and analytical component to the NSTS organizational structure should provide the needed capacity to evaluate opportunities to achieve increased efficiencies.

There are a number of areas that will require attention prior to the full E&E including the completeness and accuracy of student data, the establishment of a single, unified policy manual, and development of contracts for parents and taxi companies providing services. Continued evolution of NSTS will also require that the Board of Directors more fully define their specific role and the scope of issues they will likely address. This will ensure that NSTS receives the necessary guidance on key issues of policy (e.g., eligibility criteria, provision of courtesy transportation, and cost allocation). These elements are particularly important in order to promote the development of an NSTS culture and mindset that will be necessary for continued growth of the consortium.

Over the past six months, research has been conducted by the Research, Assessment and Evaluation Department to address the Notice of Motion. A report outlining the research is currently being drafted and will be presented to Administrative Council for review. The report and recommendations regarding the Notice of Motion will be presented at the May 12th, 2009 Committee of the Whole.

Recently, there has been extensive provincial and national discussion over the banning of the sale and distribution of bottled water by municipal governments and school boards. The basis for these bans is centred on several reasons that include:

- Environmental Impact
- Safety of tap-water
- Water as a commodity

The May 12th, 2009 report will address the implications on the ban of Single-Use Plastic Water Bottles for the Niagara Catholic District School Board and include a recommendation to the Committee of the Whole for its consideration.

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the Holy Cross Catholic School Council to provide some input and support to the recommendations that the senior staff are reviewing. It is the council's understanding that these recommendations include the following three:

- 1. "THAT, Senior Staff will continue to apply to the Ministry of Education for additional funding and to identify other sources of funding in order to provide facility plant upgrades to St. Francis Catholic Secondary School."
- 2. "THAT, Catholic Secondary Schools in St. Catharines will continue to have the opportunity to implement specialized programs providing sufficient student enrolment and Ministry of Education funding and approval."
- 3. "THAT, a St. Catharines Elementary and Secondary Ad Hoc Attendance Area Review Committee of the Board be established in September 2009 to review the attendance boundaries for all elementary and secondary schools in St. Catharines. According to the Board's Attendance Area Policy 301.3, the mandate of the committee will be to recommend to the Board stability within all attendance areas while maximizing facility utilization of all elementary and secondary schools in St. Catharines."

Regarding Recommendation #1, in order to support the curriculum we would like consideration given to the enhancement of all secondary school facilities, not only St. Francis. This suggestion also will meet the requirements indicated in Recommendation #3 of maximizing facility utilization and by reviewing boundaries.

Holy Cross has consistently emulated the over arching philosophy of community partnerships. This embraced, shared, responsibility of the Board, its staff, its students, parents, guardians, parishes and community members can only be further enhanced with

Niagara Catholic Policies Currently Under Review

Senior Staff has begun a cyclical process of reviewing all Niagara Catholic Policies and Administrative Guidelines to ensure they continue to be in compliance with current legislation and meet the needs of the system.

At the Policy Committee Meeting on April 8th, members agreed to have the following Policies vetted: Transportation Policy (500.2), Attendance Area Policy (301.3) and Administration of Prescribed Medicine During School Hours (302.2).

The Transportation Policy is being revised to meet the Ministry of Education's recommendation for a harmonized policy with the District School Board of Niagara, in order to enable Niagara Student Transportation Services to provide transportation services on a single-entity basis. The timeline for feedback on the Transportation Policy is April 21st, 2009.

Sections of the Attendance Area Policy are being removed and will be incorporated into a new Admission of Students Policy. The Administration of Prescription Medications Policy is being revised to meet Ministry of Education requirements. Feedback on both Policies must be received by May 11th. Niagara Catholic Celebrates French, Italian and Spanish

On March 24th and March 25th, thirty Niagara Catholic elementary students participated in the annual Festival d'art oratoire event at the Catholic Education Centre.

The Father Kenneth Burns Board Room was packed with students and their families who enjoyed listening to student-written French speeches on a variety of subjects. Students presented under the categories of Core French, Extended French (the Niagara Catholic Intensive Core French program) and FSL Plus (French first-language experience).

One elementary student from each category was invited to present his or her speech at the Provincial Canadian Parents for French Festival d'art oratoire, on Saturday, May 9th at the Glendon College Campus of York University in Toronto.

On March 27th, secondary school second language students participated in the annual Niagara Catholic French/Italian/Spanish Public Speaking contest at Club Roma in St. Catharines. Each student's speech was adjudicated and scored.

The first-place students in the French categories earned a spot in the Provincial Concours d'art oratories at Glendon College, where they are eligible for cash prizes.

All students were commended for the quality of their speeches and received a medal and certificate of merit.

Trustees Receive Report on Gifted Program

During the April 14th Committee of the Whole Meeting, Trustees were given an update on supplementary education opportunities available to students identified as gifted and on the process of how gifted students are identified.

Currently, Niagara Catholic has 53 elementary students eligible for the gifted module program and a total of 104 students identified as gifted throughout the Board.

The identification process begins in the Early Years, when teachers begin observing traits in students that are consistent with gifted children, such as an advanced vocabulary, the ability to think "outside the box" and the ability to generate complex ideas. The formal identification process typically begins in Grade 4.

Nomination forms are submitted by classroom teachers and the child is screened using the Canadian Test of Cognitive Skills (CTCS). Students who score at or above the 89th percentile are recommended for further assessment. Program Resource Teachers then administer subtests of Wechsler Intelligence Scale (4th Edition), and if a score of 130 or more is achieved, the recommendation could be made to formally identify the student as gifted through the IPRC process.

Niagara Catholic offers in-school enrichment opportunities for students in all elementary grades and six "congregated enrichment modules" on such topics as stopmotion animation, mathematics, orienteering, Lego robotics, making a music video and growing up gifted outside the regular classroom throughout the school year.

Transportation is provided to off-site modules.

Reading Recovery Program at Niagara Catholic

Program Staff presented an overview of the Reading Recovery Program to Trustees during the Committee of the Whole Meeting on April 14th.

The program is an early intervention that targets Grade One students who are struggling to acquire reading and writing skills during regular classroom lessons. Those students receive 30 minutes of daily individual instruction by a trained Reading Recovery teacher. The program accelerates learning to the point that students are often able to effectively participate in regular classroom activities in 12 to 20

weeks. Those who are not ready to resume lessons with the rest of their class after that time period are offered assistance through further intervention.

Niagara Catholic has partnered with the Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board to administer the Reading Recovery program since 1996. Both Boards are registered sites for Reading Recovery. In the 2002-03 school year, a Niagara Catholic teacher became a certified teacher trainer and Niagara Catholic opened its training facility, which is located at St. Thomas More Catholic Elementary School in Niagara Falls.

Staff monitor the need for Reading Recovery programs in schools annually based on priority needs. Observation Surveys, PM Benchmarks and EQAO results are used to determine the need for a program, as are teacher leader recommendations and school profiles. There are currently Reading Recovery programs in 22 Niagara Catholic schools.


