In keeping with the Mission, Vision and Values of the Niagara Catholic District School Board, Niagara Catholic is committed to providing the best educational facilities that advance student achievement for all and build strong Catholic identity and community.

In accordance with the Ministry of Education, the Niagara Catholic District School Board recognizes its responsibility:

- To provide adequate accommodation and instruction for all pupils attending its schools;
- To undertake long-term capital planning;
- To operate its schools economically and efficiently, while providing the best Catholic education for the pupils, within the limits of the Board's available resources;
- To explore opportunities for effective, sustainable partnerships; and
- To maintain communication with stakeholders and potential partners concerning possible changes in the status of a school or of school boundaries.

The Board acknowledges that the consolidation or closure of schools may be required to meet the above objectives. The Board is committed to providing student accommodation in a responsible and organized manner considering reasonable and just alternatives.

The Director of Education shall present an Initial Staff Report to the Board to review a school or schools for potential consolidation or closure. The Board may establish an Accommodation Review Committee (ARC) and provide the terms of reference or proceed to a Modified Accommodation Review Process.

The Board shall consider consolidation or closure of a school(s) following the submission of the Final Staff Report which will contain feedback from an Accommodation Review Committee and/or a community consultation. The Niagara Catholic District School Board has the discretion to approve the recommendation(s) of the Final Staff Report as presented, modify the recommendation(s) of the report or approve a different outcome. The final decision regarding the future of a school or group of schools rests solely with the Board of Trustees.

The Director of Education will issue Administrative Operational Procedures in support of this policy.

ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL YEAR CALENDARS: 2023-2024

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The *Education Act, Regulation 304 - School Year Calendar, Professional Activity Days* outlines the requirements and timelines for preparing and submission of school year calendars to the Ministry of Education for approval.

For the 2023-2024 school year calendars, there are 195 possible school days between September 1, 2023 and June 30, 2024. Within this total, elementary and secondary schools must have a minimum of 194 school days, of which seven (7) days must be designated as professional activity days. Secondary schools may have a maximum of ten (10) instructional days set as examination days. The remaining school days shall be instructional days.

The 2023-2024 School Year Calendar Committee met to discuss and review the draft calendar and the consultation process.

Autism Ontario Niagara Region – Alexandria Attree

Autism Niagara met 2 days ago with Autism Ontario. They have created a paid position - SEAC Representative for Autism Ontario. We found information we were getting was inconsistent, so they are creating a newsletter across all of Ontario. I recommended that when they report have it broken up into elementary and secondary because transitions are different (into JK/into secondary).

Also the March Break Funding Lottery is closing soon but anybody with Ontario Autism Program (OAP) number you can apply. Covers activities up to \$500/\$1000 for a child to participate in activities during March break. Communication was sent out before Christmas for people with OAP numbers to register. Information that was provided will be sent to Elizabeth to distribute to our committee and get it out to our school communities.

We have after school cooking programs starting up next week at St Therese. Teams in secondary schools are starting back up as well. We are excited to move forward with that.

Secondary Principal – Adele

We are starting to plan the review of IPRC (Special Needs during exam time).

We are beginning the transition to high school process – including visits to elementary schools, conversations with parents and elementary ERT/classroom teacher visits.

Students from Niagara College ABA Services Program have been placed across Niagara Catholic and are starting their practical hours. We welcome them.

Elementary Principal – Susy

Looking forward to February were we will be working with parents of 1st year kindergarten, especially those will special education needs. We offer as many visits as possible. We welcome everyone back. Christmas break was tough for some families. School attendance of our special needs students has been up. We are focusing on transitioning students into a comforting routine.

Student Support Department – Anthony

SEAC Survey: The Coordinators are working with Christine Battagli, Consultant for Research, Assessment and Evaluation to begin formatting the survey in Qualtrics software. Our target release to families in the system will be at the start of March 2023, with data available for analysis and discussion in April/May. The invitational letter to families may be shared at the February SEAC, and a copy of the survey questions may be shared with SEAC as part of this report.

Kindergarten transition to School: Information sharing has begun with parents. Student Support Coordinators are representing Niagara Catholic at Parent Information Nights presented by the Niagara Children's Centre. Two virtual sessions have taken place on Tuesday December 6th, 2022 at 9:30 a.m. and Tuesday December 13th, 2022 at 6:30 pm. One additional Parent Information Night is begin held in-person at the Niagara Children's Centre on January 12th 2023 (tomorrow) @ 6:30pm. The sessions have been well attended by families who received information from Niagara Catholic and our co-terminus Niagara Boards. Question-and-answer sessions have/will take place at each presentation to address any questions regarding entry to school.

"SNAP" (Supporting Neurodiversity through Adaptive Programming): Niagara Catholic participants enjoyed the Fall Session and we are looking forward to the Winter SNAP sessions offered through Brock University. The program includes a wide range of activities such as educational gymnastics, dance and movement education, games, and other activities of daily living. Activities can be modified to meet the needs and capabilities of the individual participating. The second half of our Niagara Catholic schools have had a chance to register with their visit date being sometime during these next few months. Sessions begin February 9th and will continue through to April.

Gifted Module: Niagara Catholic is offering the next Gifted Module to those students identified. Using VEX I.Q. robotics, students will be immersed in this hands on S.T.R.E.A.M. (Science Technology Religion Engineering Art and Mathematics) based

module, working both individually and as a team to engage in a variety of problems using coding. By strengthening their understanding of coding and robotics, students will become innovators, thinkers and problem-solving leaders. This is the first of a two-part module to explore, investigate and deepen their understanding of coding, with the creation of a final project to consolidate their learning.

Superintendent Pizzoferrato – Mark May 28 to June 3 – **National AccessAbility Week** (red shirt day May 31) Under C. Mc Mullin leadership we secured \$10000 grant. We have a number of principals and staff partnering to plan an experience to develop an experience with children and families - children to develop a plan to take back to school. Very excited. Lots of work is happening behind the scenes.

SEAC Brochure – Is ready to send out to Niagara Catholic schools.

Empower – Aggressively brought it forward in Niagara Catholic. 3 schools missed opportunity. We have a creative solution to bring the experience to them in the fall.

Costs are \$5600/per site X 47 schools now and 50 as of September and involves 1 hour of focused reading instruction to small groups of 6 to 8 students every day with 5 schools that have 2 programs - 110 lessons each school year. Students are tracked upon entry to the program and exit of the program.
