REMEMBRANCE DAY



The other common name for this day is Armistice Day which marks the date and time when armies stopped fighting World War I. on November 11th at 11am in 1918 (the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month). Some 100,000 Canadian soldiers died in the First and Second World Wars.

All government buildings fly the Canadian flag at half-mast this day and people remember those who fought for Canada during a two minute silence at 11am. Many people wear poppies before and on Remembrance Day to show their respect and support for Canadian troops. Poppies are generally handed out free but often a voluntary donation is given in exchange.

The St. Teresa of Calcutta Catholic Elementary School community will be having a Remembrance Day Service/Liturgy on **Friday, November 10th starting at 10:40 a.m.** Parents are welcome to attend. The legion will be handing out poppies this year to the students. Donations are always welcome to support our veterans.

DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME **ENDS NOVEMBER 5th, 2023**

When local daylight time is about to reach Sunday, November 5th, 2022, **2:00:00 AM** clocks are turned **backward** 1 hour to Sunday, November 6, 2023, **1:00:00 AM** local standard time instead.

Sunrise and sunset will be about 1 hour earlier on November 7, 2023 than the day before. There will be more light in the morning.

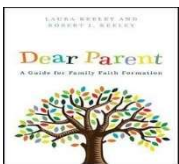


E-MAIL ADDRESS & TEXT MESSAGES

WHEN TO KEEP YOUR CHILD AT HOME???

Please keep your child at home and away from others if he/she has any of these symptoms:

- Fever;
- Diarrhea;
- Sore Throat;
- Rash;
- Vomiting;
- Frequent coughing and/or sneezing;
- Yellow or green discharge from nose, ears or eyes.

WASH YOUR HANDS

Clean your hands to prevent the spread of germs and reduce your risk of getting sick. Wash your hands after;

- Coughing or sneezing;
- Blowing your nose;
- Using the washroom;
- Playing with pets;
- Playing outdoor;
- Before preparing meals and eating.

Use warm water and soap, lather and scrub for at least 15 minutes. Have children sing the ABC song, so they scrub for long enough. Alcohol-based sanitizers are safe for children and can be used when you do not see any dirt.
