SAFE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

As we continue to assess areas of concern surrounding student safety, we would like to offer the following reminders.

- Park only in designated areas leave the bus zone free from vehicles. Do not leave your car idling.
- Drive slowly and cautiously in the parking lot.
- Do not use staff parking lot to drop off your child. This is extremely dangerous.
- Do not leave students in the schoolyard unsupervised before or after school. Please refer to supervision schedules below.

SAFETY REMINDERS

RIDING BIKES – With the warmer weather approaching, a number or students are riding their bikes to school. Students are reminded to bring a lock for their bikes to keep them from being stolen.

For safety reasons, students must wear a helmet and walk the bike on school property avoiding the driveways. Do not bring scooters to school. We have nowhere safe to store them.

ANAPHYLAXIS – We have some students with Anaphylaxis: a life threatening condition caused by an allergic reaction to certain foods, insect stings, medications, products, etc. It can lead to a loss of life in as little time as five minutes, if not responded to immediately.

If a child has an allergic reaction he/she must be given a needle injection (Epi-pen) immediately and rushed to hospital. As spring approaches, we remind our students that snacks are not permitted outside, so as not to attract bees. Also, we encourage students to keep our school **peanut-safe.**

Catholic Education Week 2024

Niagara Catholic elementary and secondary schools will be celebrating Catholic Education week (CEW) with the theme of "We are called to love."

EQAO: Provincial Assessment

Students in Grades 3 & 6 will participate in the Provincial Assessment during the time period of May – June. This annual testing provides the school board and school an overview of how students are mastering skills and understanding concepts in language and math. The 2 ½ day assessment provides percentages of students achieving at Level 1-3 and above.

The administration of the Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, Primary and Junior Divisions (Grade 3 and Grade 6), Spring 2023, will be held in May and June. Specific dates will be communicated out once confirmed.

A virtual EQAO parent night for our Grade 3 and 6 parents was also planned on **Tuesday**, **March 26 at 6 pm**.

Top 10 Things to Help the Environment

- 1. Smart Shopping Buy what you need, not what you want. Buy used items.
- 2. Simple Savers- weather strip windows and doors, use aerators on faucets, replace incandescent light bulbs with fluorescent ones
- 3. Transportation Alternatives Walk, cycle, car pool and use public transportation. Reduce idling
- 4. Food Choices- choose local and organic foods, eat less meat
- 5. Washing and Drying Wash full loads of clothes in cold water and hang to dry

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- 6. Heating and Cooling For summer air conditioning, set your thermostat to 24°C or 25°C. For winter heating, set your thermostat to 19°C or 20°C. Install ceiling fans and programmable thermostats
- 7. Close to Home Travel and work as close to home as possible
- 8. Bathroom Basics Take short showers instead of baths, close water taps while brushing your teeth
- Careful Cleaning Choose natural, non-toxic cleaning products; make simple, natural cleaners with ingredients like vinegar, baking soda and water
- 10. Don't Discard Donate, reuse and recycle items before throwing them into the trash. Harmful materials like chemicals, batteries, electronics, etc. should be taken to local hazardous waste depots or recyclers.

CHILDREN AND CONCUSSIONS

Physical activity is great for children, but there is always a risk when kids are involved in active play. Parents should be aware that a bump to the head, face or neck, or a blow to the body can result in a possible concussion. Concussions can be serious, and a person does not need to be knocked out to have a concussion. Some signs of a possible concussion include:

- Headache, dizziness, nausea or vomiting
- Trouble seeing or hearing
- Crankiness, sadness, nervousness or other changes in behaviour
- Confusion, forgetfulness or repeating the same thing

Help the child who was hurt to a safe place and get medical attention. If a concussion is diagnosed, the child should not attend school or participate in activities until told to do so by the doctor. Parents should alert the school and coach if their child has been diagnosed with a concussion before returning to school or other activities.
