


DRESS CODE REMINDERS

North of 60 Project—Supporting our Northern Neighbours in Need



Teams of Vincentian volunteers from the south help neighbours in need in 16 Northern Canadian communities whose needs continue to increase. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul St. Catharines Central Council have been helping with the North of 60 Project Naujaat Nunavut (also know as Repulse Bay) since 2016. Residents in this community actively pursue hunting, fishing and trapping to survive. There are 40 families in need of help this year. Each Niagara Catholic School has been invited to collect 1 food item. Canadian Martyrs Catholic Elementary School has been asked to donate **granola bars**. During the week of June 3rd, we kindly ask for your donation of granola bars to support this community in need.

BALANCED DAY 2024-2025

All Niagara Catholic elementary schools will be on a Balanced School Day schedule effective September 3, 2024. A Balanced School Day is a modified elementary school schedule designed to enhance learning, foster healthy habits, and encourage daily physical activity. To accommodate these changes, the school day will be extended by 10 minutes.

Each year, Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) reviews efficiencies in transportation services for eligible students. This collaboration is done in cooperation with both boards served by NSTS.

The review for the 2024-2025 school year is now complete. We are sharing this information to advise you of a change in bell times at Canadian Martyrs to allow you as much time as possible to plan for the change. Beginning in September 2024 we will have an earlier start to the day, with the bell time changing from 8:35 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. Morning supervision will begin at 8:15 a.m. The dismissal bell time will also be a bit later and

to 8:30 a.m. Morning supervision will begin at 8:15 a.m. The dismissal bell time will also be a bit later and change from 2:45 p.m. to 2:50 p.m.

Please note that these bell time changes will impact bus pick-up and drop-off times. This will be communicated by NSTS during the regular process for the 2024-2025 school year and will be made available on the NSTS Portal in mid-August. NSTS will communicate more specific timelines closer to the end of this school year. A Balanced School Day schedule comprises three instructional blocks interspersed with two nutritional breaks of 40 minutes, allowing 20 minutes for a nourishing lunch and an additional 20 minutes of outdoor physical activity. A typical Balanced School Day at Canadian Martyrs will be:

- 8:40 a.m. 10:40 a.m. 120 Instructional Minutes
- 10:40 a.m. 11:20 a.m. 40 Minutes Nutrition/Physical Activity Break
- 11:20 a.m. 12:40 p.m. 80 Instructional Minutes
- 12:40 p.m. 1:20 p.m. 40 Minutes Nutrition/Physical Activity Break
- 1:20 p.m. 2:40 p.m. 80 Instructional Minutes
- 2:40 p.m. 2:50 p.m. Dismissal Procedures
- *NEW END TIME* 2:50 p.m. Dismissal

Tips for Parents - How to Plan and Prepare for Nutritional Breaks

Packing a nutritious meal for the Balanced School Day can be both enjoyable and straightforward. Here are some suggestions to help you plan a healthy lunch for your child:

- Divide a single lunch into two portions to ensure adequacy for each nutritional break.
- Wrap sandwiches individually or cut them in half.
- Separate fruits, vegetables, crackers, and cheese into labelled bags for each break.
- Consider providing two healthy drinks for each break.
- Avoid packing foods containing nuts or nut products to support our peanut-safe schools.
- Involve your child in planning and preparing their nutritional breaks.
- Ensure your child includes a balanced selection of healthy foods if they are responsible for packing their lunch.
- Aim to include items from three of the five food groups outlined in Canada's Food Guide to Healthy Eating for each break.
