
HAPPY NEW YEAR!

WINTER IS HERE - RECESS FUN! Indoor shoes recommended.

Winter is here and it is also that time of year where students are able to enjoy the snow during recess time. We ask that all students in K to Grade 3 wear snow pants/splash pants, boots and other winter items for playing in the snow. This will ensure the students stay warm and free from wet clothing. Students in grade 4 to 8 need to wear boots to be able to go into the field area to play in the snow. The reason for this is that running shoes and other footwear are very slippery in the snow.

<u>Dress for the weather</u> - we go outside all recesses unless extreme cold weather alert is issued, or there is other inclement weather present.

All students in Grade K to 8 are recommended to have a second set of shoes at the school. This will help to reduce the small puddles of water under students' desks when they come inside after recess from the snow melting and avoid having slippery wet surfaces in the classroom.


Inclement Weather - Cancellations and Closures

If you are dropping off a lunch please ensure it is clearly labelled with the student's name and is delivered no later that 11:35 am.

Student Cell Phone Use While in School

This is a reminder that cell phones or other technologies are not to be used at school unless directed by the classroom teacher and under the classroom teacher's supervision. Cell phones, computers, chromebooks, tablets are not to be used during recesses or lunch breaks. Pictures/videos are not to be taken by students pertaining to any aspect of the school day unless directed by the classroom teacher. Students should never upload photos/videos related to the school day to a personal social media site or other digital platforms. Father Hennepin school will be sharing happenings/photos through Instagram and Twitter following privacy permissions provided by parent/guardian.

If an emergency arises and a parent needs to get a hold of their child, a call to the school's direct line can be made and Mrs. Iuliano will forward the message.

Father Hennepin Catholic is not responsible for any lost or damaged cell phone/technology that is brought to school. Cell phones are to be kept turned off for the duration of the instructional school day unless the classroom teacher approves the use for educational purposes.

Playground items, Birthday Celebrations & Toys from Home

We are receiving requests to bring in cupcakes and other items in celebration of a child's birthday. While this gesture is appreciated, these items are best used with events planned at home or after school. We do assist in handing out birthday invitations and also celebrate the child's birthday on morning announcements. Some classes also sing Happy Birthday to the student in the classroom now that we are able to sing again. Thank you for keeping these food/gift tems at home as they will not be distributed to students.

Please keep personal toys or trading cards at home; especially in the primary grades. They are best kept at home as they are typically a distraction at school. As with past practice for many years at Father Hennepin, staff will help a student use strategies to return to "green zone" if they are upset if a toy was lost, stolen or broken however in most circumstances will not be not be investigating what happened.

Drop off times start at 8:15 - School starts at 8:30 am

Supervision is provided between 8:15 am and 8:30 am and between 2:40 pm to 2:55 pm.

Students MUST only arrive or be dropped of between: 8:15am and 8:30am - staff will be outside and in school hallways providing supervision. Any student arriving or being dropped off outside of these times are being left WITHOUT ANY ADULT SUPERVISION and are accepting responsibility for the risks involved in doing so.

Families arriving in the Kiss n Ride are asked to wait until staff come out for supervision before allowing their child to leave the vehicle.

<u>Arriving after 8:30-</u> please make sure your child enters the main doors - there is no staff at other doors to let them in.

Parents/guardians who need care prior to 8:15 am have the option of contacting Boys and Girls Club Niagara or YMCA to set up child care.

KISS N RIDF - stay in vehicles if using kiss n ride drive thru lanes



Parents/guardians or the adult using the Kiss n Ride drive thru area **are to stay in their vehicle**. When the driver gets out it causes a lot of hazards and slows down the drop off area.

- ensure backpacks are ready to go with the child and not stowed in a trunk.
- Students exit the right side of the vehicle.
- Staff will assist with baby seats for youngest students.
- If you want to get out of your car to assist your child, you will need to park your vehicle

This is particularly for the first group (Kindergarten).

- * Remain in your vehicle until your child is brought out to the Kiss N Ride, this will help if we need you to drive around.
- * if you are FIRST in the Kiss N Ride be prepared to "go around" to allow the cars behind you who have already received their child to exit the Kiss N Ride.
- * Some of our younger students need to be strapped into car seats which could cause a slight delay. From time to time you may need to drive around the car in front of you to safely exit the Kiss n Ride. Please do so with caution.
- * Adhere to the one-way signs.
- * if you do not want to drive around another car to exit the Kiss N Ride please use one of the parking spots. You can then get out of your car and greet your child in the grass area.

Educational staff's primary focus is the students they are dismissing, there may be many occasions where they are unable to help direct the flow of traffic.

Staff have been directed by the City of Niagara Falls that they are not to direct the flow of traffic by walking into the middle of the crosswalk to stop traffic. It is important that vehicles follow the pedestrian crosswalk arrows and not enter the crosswalk area until people have crossed the road safely.

Parents can access the Brightspace Parent Portal by going to: https://niagaracatholic.elearningontario.ca/, or by downloading the "Brightspace Parent & Guardian" app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store.

Please Note: If you are accessing the Brightspace Parent Portal via the app, you will be asked to identify the school first. Please type in **Niagara CDSB**.

To log in you will be presented with the image on the left.

Please use the "Guest Login" option at the bottom of the page.

The username is the email address that you have provided to your child's school.

The first time you access this, you will need to click "forgot your password" to receive an email with a password reset link. Once you have created a password you will be able to access the site and see your child's class information.

Clicking on your child's name will enable you to see evidence of learning that has been shared by the teacher. You will be able to see posts by the teacher in this virtual space and portfolio evidence that has been shared. Individual assignment grades and feedback may be shared by teachers in this portal.

This is <u>not</u> your child's grade in the course. Overall course achievement and reporting are made available through our <u>Maplewood Parent Portal</u>.

Communication through these platforms is one-way only.

ALLERGY AWARE SCHOOL - NUT SAFE - ANAPHYLAXES

Within our school community, there are several students who have a life-threatening allergy (anaphylaxis) to foods, predominantly to peanuts and tree nuts (e.g. almond, cashew, hazelnut, pistachio).

We feel the best way to reduce the risk of accidental exposure to these students is to respectfully ask for the co-operation of the parents/guardians within this school community to avoid sending peanut butter or products with peanuts listed in the ingredients. There is a wide range of nutritious foods available to pack for your child. Visit www.eatrightontario.ca for suggestions. For more information on anaphylaxis, visit www.anaphylaxis.ca or www.aaia.ca We are working hard at preventing accidental exposure. It is also important that we have common routines throughout the entire school. www.aaia.ca (washrooms, fountains, gym, library, computers, etc.) with allergens. The teachers will explain the importance of the following health and safety routines to the students in their classrooms:

- 1. Wash your hands with soap and water before and after eating.
- 2. Do not bring food that contains peanuts/tree nuts.
- 3. Do not accept food from other students especially if you have food allergies.
- 4. Snacks are not permitted outside in the schoolyard.
- 5. Dispose of all food waste properly.

Safe Arrival - Reporting Absences using School Messenger



All parents/guardians are required to report child's absence prior to 8:15 am each day. If an absence is unverified, the automated system will continue to contact you until your child's whereabouts is known; safety is our top priority. We may need to contact the Niagara Regional Police for assistance with unverified absences.

Absences can be reported by using school messenger or by calling the toll free number. If you have questions regarding school messenger, please contact the school and Mrs. Iluiano (secretary) will assist you.

- 1. Use the SafeArrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account using your email address. After logging in, select the Attendance tab to Report an Absence.
- 2. Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app (blue logo) from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). Use your new login information to access your account. Select Attendance to Report an Absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications on your mobile device please enable that in the Settings area of the app.
- 3. The current toll-free number 844-287-6287 also allows you to report your child absence. The system is available 24hrs each day.

- Parents who use the Kiss N- Ride are asked to follow the following safety guidelines:
- Pedestrian Crossover (NEW) by City of Niagara Falls. See attached PDF for Driver expectations regarding fines and demerit points. Stop before the white triangles on the road when students are crossing in the crosswalk
- Kiss N Ride ONE WAY traffic

Students are ready to exite vehicle and vehicle are always attended by a driver in the Kiss N Ride. Parking spots are available if you wish to get out to assist your child.

- If you are holding up a line of cars wishing to exit we will ask you to go around.
- Students should exit vehicles in the right lane (closest to the curb) and on the right hand side of the vehicle for safety purposes.
- · At the end of day 2 lanes are used for families waiting.
