Reading Intervention supports for primary and junior grades

- Elementary Chaplains will be visiting the school to lead activities with our students while staff meet with Literacy and Numeracy consultants.
 Kindergarten to grade 2 teachers will dive deeper into the Science of Reading focusing on Phonemic Awareness and decoding strategies.
 Grades 3 to 8 teachers will be focusing on fundamental concepts in Numeracy that lead to an understanding of Algebraic concepts.
- Additional Lexia Licenses are being purchased and will be assigned to more students
- **Empower** began today and will continue for the entire school year
- Really Great Reading Intervention Groups Mrs. Zamfir will be leading a
 reading intervention group with students from grade 2. Mrs. Zamfir
 received training and taught the intervention program this past summer. A
 group of 5 students will be participating for five weeks. After the 5 weeks,
 another group of 5 students will begin. This cycle will continue until the end
 of this school year.

Staff are looking forward to meeting our families and enjoying time together. **Sports/Clubs/Extra Curricular Activities**: Cross Country running tryouts have started. Thank you to Mrs. Melfi and Mrs. Pellizzari for taking the lead and coaching our students. Starting with grade 4, 5 boys and 5 girls from each grade will be selected to attend the Family of Schools Cross Country Meet on Wednesday October 12th.

Milk Bag Weaving: We are starting our milk bag weaving initiative and asking the community to bring in milk bags. Last year we made 3 mats and we would like to make 5 this school year. Can be sent in at any time.

Facilities updates: Our library was successfully moved to the stage. Mrs. Flynn is our new library technician and she has been working hard at getting the library up and running for all of our students. Books are being purchased.

Twitter/Instagram school account: Once all consent forms have been finalized for this school year, our twitter and Instagram accounts will be up and running once again. Mrs. Semple and Madame Appel will be taking the lead on our social media accounts. Pictures and not names will be visible.

Terry Fox Walk: Last Friday, we took part in the annual Terry Fox Walk for Cancer Research. All classes participated in the walk as we worked together to raise money for cancer research. Thank you for your continued support! As of today we have raised \$1293.00.

Hallowe'en: This year we will be following the same format for Halloween as last year. Students are welcome to wear their costumes to school on Monday, October 31st. As an alternative, students are welcome to wear orange/purple and black as this will be an out of dress code day. We ask that costumes that intend to scare, including props, are to be saved for Halloween night. Halloween at school is for fun, and scary costumes are not fun for some of our younger students or students with special needs. Halloween activities will be taking place in each classroom throughout the day. Please remember that we have many students with food sensitivities and allergies, including lifethreatening anaphylaxis. We ask parents to refrain from sending in food items.
