Catholic School Council Financial Statement - Mrs. Laflamme explained the financial statements. The Raffle Account has \$9238.24 remaining. An expense of \$234.83 was deducted from this account for the purchase of recess equipment. Additional purchases of wall-mounted flat-screen TVs have been made to support teaching and learning in 4 classrooms. There is no change since the last meeting to the Catholic School Council account which is at \$1609.82.

## November Happenings

The week of November 1-5 was Treaties Recognition Week. Students learned about the meaning of the word treaty and different Indigenous Treaties. Teachers were provided with grade-appropriate resources/mentor texts to assist in explaining the importance of building relationships within the

community and how these relationships are important to the foundation of treaties. Students also are learning that Indigenous peoples have and continue to influence and make contributions to society.

Eco Club - The Eco club is encouraging students to bring waste-free lunches on Wednesdays and recycle lunch items on other days.

Remembrance Day - We would like to acknowledge Mr. Palka's and Mrs. Riganelli's Grade 5 classes for presenting a thoughtful and meaningful Remembrance Day service. The students were well prepared and adapted seamlessly when presenting the service outside.

The week of November 15-19 was Bullying Awareness Week. At the start of the week, the students participated in 'Silly Sock Day' which helped to remind us all that God created us to be unique and different. Each class was provided with coloured paper so that each student could write One Kind Word on the paper. These papers were then assembled to make a rainbow on a bulletin board in the library. Each day a quote was read over the announcements about using kind words and how they can make a difference.

On November 26th, the students were encouraged to wear plaid in support of Pathstones and Mental Health initiatives.

# **December Happenings**

December 10th is Joy Day at Canadian Martyrs and the students may wear red and green on this day. Classrooms will be decorating their doors on this day with the theme of Christmas.

Advent - as the Advent season approaches, Mrs. Sciarra and Ms. Vandenbraak's classes prepared and presented a thoughtful and creative Advent prayer Service for the first week of Advent - Hope which will be presented to the school in two different assemblies. The student council will be preparing two of the other Advent Prayer Services.

The Student Council has organized and will be running a Toy Drive from November 29th- December 10th. They are collecting toys and warm winter gear for Community Care and gift cards for Gillian's Place. They will be accepting toys for all ages. Please keep older students in mind. Department store gift cards and gas cards will be useful donations as well. All items must be new due to Covid-19 protocols.

On December 15th, the students will be participating in the St. Alfred School Mass. The Grade 2s, 3s, and 4s will be attending the mass in person and will travel to the church on their own buses.

CM Spirit Wear orders arrived yesterday (November 29th) and were sent home with students or parents arranged a time in which they would pick up the order from the school office.

The last day of school before the Christmas Break is Thursday, December 23rd. This day will be pajama day for students.

## **Additional Discussion Items**

• Since families were not able to participate live in the Remembrance Day celebration or the Advent Celebration, CSC members wonder if it is possible to share photos with the families; Mrs. Incaviglia will discuss this with staff for future events; we need to be mindful that many families

- have not granted permission for their children to be photographed or recorded and not granted permission for their children to be on social media, therefore, we cannot broadcast these events on Google Meet or YouTube.
- If COVID protocols are lifted at the end of March, CSC members are wondering if there will be a return to normal activities in school such as sports and field trips Mrs. Incaviglia indicated that no information has been communicated yet regarding a change in protocols; the Board's COVID team meets with Public Health regularly and will communicate changes as they arise.
- Since students have missed out on opportunities over the last 20 months, will the school try to
  recapture these lost opportunities, for example, the grade 4 trip to Medieval Times Mrs.
  Incaviglia will discuss this with staff and consider the options, however, it is difficult to anticipate
  when we will be able to return to these types of activities. It will also be difficult to recreate all
  missed opportunities due to the pandemics.
