
Prayer for a New School Year

- 2. Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app (blue logo) from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). Use your new login information to access your account. Select Attendance to Report an Absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications on your mobile device please enable that in the Settings area of the app.
- 3. The current toll-free number 844-287-6287 will still allow you to report your child absent.
- ** If you do not report your child absent the system will continue to call you until you confirm. The best way to ensure the system does not call you constantly is to report the absence in advance or confirm on the first system call. Thank you for your cooperation with this!! **

National Day of Truth & Reconciliation - September 30, 2024 (Orange Shirt Day)

Orange Shirt Day is the story of Phyllis Webstad, an Indigenous woman who shared her experience at an Indian Residential School through the children's book, *The Orange Shirt Story*. By participating in Orange Shirt Day, we recognize the harm done to generations of children by the Indian Residential School system in Canada. The first time Orange shirt day was recognized in Canada was September 30th, 2013. Since that time **Orange Shirt Day** has grown into a national awareness among schools, businesses, and communities.

In June 2021, the Federal Government of Canada designated September 30th as the **National Day for Truth & Reconciliation**. While this addresses Call to Action #80 of the Truth and Reconciliations *94 Calls to Action*, it coincides with an established day that was created by Survivors of Indian Residential Schools. Students will recognize this day and wear ORANGE on *September 30th!*

Anaphylaxis

At St. Kevin Catholic School, we continue to have several students with Anaphylaxis – a severe life threatening condition caused by an allergic reaction to certain food products (i.e.) PEANUTS, dairy, medications, latex products, inhalers and insect stings from bees or wasps. Residue on any material that has been touched by hands that have not been properly washed may also trigger a severe allergic reaction. Anaphylaxis requires immediate first aid (Epipen) and immediate medical intervention.

Classroom teachers who have children with Anaphylaxis are working hard to prevent accidental exposure to products that trigger life-threatening reactions. We will also be forwarding home a letter informing all parents of the presence of an anaphylactic child in the school and requesting that all parents co-operate by not sending to their classroom specific foods for lunch or snacks that could trigger a life threatening reaction for the Anaphylactic student.

Thank you in advance for your assistance and co-operation regarding this life threatening matter.

Insurance Forms

Early in the school year a Student Accident Insurance Policy form will be sent to you via email. If you choose to take out insurance for your child(ren), please return the form by mail directly to the Insurance Company.

Lockers/Shared Spaces

Students <u>will</u> be able to use the lockers in the school. Shared spaces such as the Library (when complete) and Gym will be in full use.

Shared materials/equipment will be permitted. Staff will remind students of the importance of hand hygiene after using shared materials, particularly when shared materials cannot regularly be cleaned. Students are permitted to bring equipment from home to use at recess.

Bikes, Skateboards, Scooters Safety

As we have been having wonderful weather this year, children will be enjoying the opportunity to ride their bikes/scooter/skateboard to school. Please remind your child to always walk their bike or scooter on school property. Students are required to wear helmets and are encouraged to lock their bikes while on school property. Any bike/scooter/skateboard will not be stored inside the school. Students must use the bike rack outside. Please remember to lock your belongings.

Ryan's Law - Asthma Friendly Schools

Ryan's Law (Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools) is an important step to support the health and well-being of students diagnosed with asthma in Ontario schools. During the past school year the Niagara Catholic District School Board has created an Asthma Policy. If your child has been diagnosed with asthma, please contact the school office to provide information about your child's asthma medication. You will be required to complete and submit the Niagara Catholic Student Asthma management Plan for your child. Any student under the age of 16 years will be permitted to carry and administer his/her asthma medication at school with your consent. A student 16 years or older is not required to have his/her parent's or guardian's permission to carry the asthma medication.

Medic Alert's No Child Without Program is at St. Kevin Catholic School

The *No Child Without* program offers a free MedicAlert membership to students who attend St. Kevin Catholic School and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14th birthday. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis then you should consider a MedicAlert membership through this program.

Your child's voice in an emergency, MedicAlert membership;

Gives emergency first responders immediate access to your child's medical information on their MedicAlert bracelet or necklet

Enables first responders to quickly obtain up to date medical information by means of the child's Electronic Health Record through the **24 Hour Emergency Hotline.**

Communicates with the parent or emergency contact upon activation of the Hotline

Allows free updates of the child's medical record as needed

MedicAlert identification can alert school staff, friends, coaches and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur.

If your child is already part of the *No Child Without* program and there have been changes to their medical condition, medications or emergency contact information, call MedicAlert at 1-866-679-3220 Ext 1 to update your child's file.

Bus Safety

At the Stop Be 5 to 10 minutes early, and stand on the inside of the sidewalk/ shoulder away from the

roadway.

When the Bus Arrives Line up in a straight line, wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and the doors to open, and

never touch the outside of the bus.

Getting on the Bus Get on the bus one at a time, hold the handrail as you climb the stairs, and go directly to your

seat and get settled.

Riding on the Bus Sit with your back to back of the seat and your bottom to the bottom of your seat with your

school bag on your lap, and use your quiet speaking voice so that the bus driver can concentrate

on driving.

Getting off the Bus Stay in your seat until the bus comes to a complete stop, only get off the bus at your school or

at your bus stop, look for your parent/ guardian before you get off the bus if that is your routine, and always tell the bus driver if you do not see your parent/ guardian at the bus stop waiting for

you if that is your routine or if you missed the stop.

Crossing in Front of the Bus Watch and wait for the bus driver to signal to you to cross the road once it is safe to do so.

Rowan's Law Day - September 25, 2024

The last Wednesday in September every year is Rowan's Law Day (#RowansLawDay) – a day to engage students, staff, coaches, and parents/guardians in activities that increase awareness about concussions and to share Rowan Stringer's story.

Rowan Stringer loved rugby. A competitive and keen athlete, she was captain of her high school's team. Tragically, in May 2013, 17-year old Rowan died as the result of head injuries she sustained while playing rugby. In the week before her last game, Rowan was hit twice while playing, likely sustaining a concussion after each blow. Her concussions went unreported, and she continued to play. Rowan suspected something wasn't right—she texted a friend about her condition and used Google to search for information about concussions. When she was hit again in her final game, Rowan suffered what is known as Second Impact Syndrome—catastrophic swelling caused by a second injury to a brain still healing from previous trauma. Rowan collapsed on the field on May 8, 2013, and died four days later.

UNDERSTANDING CHANGES COMING TO ALL SCHOOLS

Earlier this spring, the Ministry of Education issued new requirements for school boards to follow to ensure the health, safety, and well-being of everyone in our schools.

The revised PPM 128 addresses issues including the use of cell phones and vaping. PPM 170 outlines the Ministry of Education's expectations for communication between home and school.

All Niagara Catholic schools will follow these Ministry of Education directives.

CELL PHONE USE IN SCHOOLS

As we continue to foster a safe and positive learning environment for all students, I would like to remind you of the new regulations regarding cell phone use that have been implemented in Ontario schools.

To minimize distractions and maximize learning, cell phones are only permitted during instructional time when they are being used for educational purposes as directed by the teacher. Outside of these times, students are expected to keep their phones turned off and stored away unless needed for documented learning needs and/or health related requirements. We kindly ask for your support in reinforcing this policy with your children and encouraging them to focus on their studies during school hours.

Your cooperation is essential in helping us maintain a healthy and respectful school environment. If you have any questions or concerns regarding these rules, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

CIGARETTES, VAPING, OR NICOTINE, CANNABIS, OR ALCOHOL USE AT SCHOOL

Another measure coming into effect in September to protect the health and well-being of students is the installation of sensors to detect vaping in schools.

The Smoke-Free Ontario Act bans the use of any tobacco, nicotine, or e-cigarette (vape) on school property. The changes to PPM 128 strengthen the enforcement of consequences for students who use or share cigarettes or other tobacco products, nicotine products, e-cigarettes (vapes) at school.

Anyone under the age of 19 is prohibited from buying or possessing alcohol or cannabis. These substances, and any illegal drug, are prohibited on school property.

The new rules require school boards to develop a policy to handle any prohibited items that are surrendered, if one does not exist already. The policy must comply with federal and provincial regulations.

To ensure compliance with the provincial regulations Niagara Catholic's Facilities Services team will install equipment to detect the use of cigarettes or e-cigarettes in schools this year.

These expectations are outlined in the Board's Electronic Communications Systems Administrative Operating Procedures for students, and the Board's Code of Conduct AOP.

We ask parents to please speak to your children about these new provincial rules and support your child's teacher(s) and principal in enforcing them.

QUESTIONS, CONCERNS, OR COMPLAINTS: UNDERSTANDING THE PROCESS

Finally, the Ministry of Education has given school boards new requirements on how we communicate with parents who have questions, concerns, or complaints.

This new guidance builds upon our established practice for resolving issues, including giving parents a timeline for a response. This is outlined in the process below. This information will also be shared on the Parents section of the Board website and school websites in time for the start of the new school year.

Niagara Catholic's Multi-Year Strategic Plan prioritizes transparency in communication with families and stakeholders as a key priority. Our Complaints Resolution Policy, first passed in April 1998, addresses the steps families must take to resolve an issue at their child's school. PPM 170 ensures commitments the provincial government made in Your child's education: A parent guide to our school system are fully addressed.

Parents/guardians should expect a response to a concern or complaint within two business days. If an inquiry needs more time, you will be given an estimated time for a detailed response at the end the second day.

If you have a question about a classroom-related matter, such as curriculum, homework, classroom behavior, or specific incidents, please contact your child's teacher.

If you cannot resolve the issue at the classroom level and/or have a question about school procedures, extracurricular activities, or safety concerns, please contact the school's vice-principal or principal.

For issues unresolved at the school level or issues related to Niagara Catholic policies, procedures, resource allocation, or other concerns, please contact the Superintendent of Education assigned to your child's school.

In keeping with the Board's commitment to accessibility, parents and guardians have a right to expect information will be delivered in clear, easy-to-understand language.
