Welcome Back New Daily Schedule Starting September 3!

For the 2024-25 school year, Notre Dame Elementary School will have earlier start and dismissal times, as well as a balanced day schedule. The morning bell will ring at <u>8:10 AM</u> and the dismissal bell will ring at <u>2:30 PM</u>. Our new <u>school balanced day</u> schedule is designed to enhance learning, foster healthy habits, and encourage daily physical activity.

For your reference, a typical day at Notre Dame will be as follows:

- 8:10 8:20 AM Student entry and morning routines
- 8:20 10:20 AM 120 instructional minutes
 - ⇒ 10:20 -10:40 AM 20 minute physical activity break (outdoor recess)

- 11:00 12:20 PM 80 instructional minutes
 - ⇒ 12:20 12:40 PM 20 minute physical activity break (outdoor recess)
 - ⇒ 12:40 1:00 PM 20 minute nutrition break (indoor lunch)
- 1:00 2:20 PM 80 instructional minutes
- 2:20 2:30 PM School day dismissal routines

Nut Free School Lunches, Alternate Lunch Days, Hydration

We encourage student lunches to be healthy and nutritious in order to provide them with the energy to maintain focus and complete classroom work to the best of their ability. There are students at Notre Dame who have an anaphylaxis allergy, so to ensure the safety of all students, all lunch items sent to school are to be nut-free.

Alternate lunch days will continue this year. Students will have the option to purchase pizza, subs, pasta, wraps, chicken dishes and salads. Any proceeds from alternate lunch days goes back to the school to pay for student learning materials. The monthly calendar and newsletter will indicate alternate lunch days for that month.

Staying hydrated is very important throughout the school day. Studies show that there is a correlation between cognitive processes and hydration levels. Students are encouraged to bring a reusable water container to school to help them stay hydrated or use the water fountains located in each hallway.

Leaving School Grounds

Any student who wishes to leave the school grounds during the school day for any reason is required to be signed out by a parent/guardian in the main office. Students will not be permitted to leave school grounds for lunch unless picked up by a parent/guardian.

If there is a change in dismissal routine, a signed note from the parent is required EACH TIME the occurrence happens. This will help the school ensure your child is safely dismissed. Texts from parents, office phone/cell phone usage will not be a regularly accepted form of permission and will only be considered in the case of an extenuating circumstance.

Overview of Selected NCDSB Policy Changes and Impacts at Notre Dame

The Ministry of Education issued new requirements for school boards to follow to ensure the health, safety, and wellbeing of everyone in our schools for the 2024-25 school year. The revised PPM 128 addresses issues including the use of cell phones and vaping. PPM 170 outlines the Ministry of Education's expectations for communication between home and school. All schools in the Niagara Catholic DSB will follow these Ministry of Education directives. The updated expectations are outlined in:

- the Electronic Communications Systems Administrative Operating Procedures for students,
- the Code of Conduct Policy AOP
- the Complaints Resolution Policy.

The Niagara Catholic's Multi-Year Strategic Plan prioritizes transparency in communication with families and stakeholders as a key priority. PPM 170 ensures commitments the provincial government made in Your child's education: A parent guide to our school system are fully addressed.

An overview of the changes are as follows:

<u>Cell Phone Use in School & Social Media Access</u>

To minimize distractions, students who bring their cell phones to school must have the <u>phone stored out of view and</u> turned off or onto silent mode during the instructional day. They may only use it if their teacher permits it for learning, for health or medical purposes, or to support special education needs. Outside of these times, students are expected to keep thier phones turned off or on silent and have them stored away.

Social media platforms on school networks and board devices will be disabled. This is intended to limit the number of interruptions in class and to benefit the mental health and well-being of students. Niagara Catholic already blocks access to some social media sites. Now all will be unavailable to students on the board network during the school day.

Cigarettes, vaping, or nicotine, cannabis, or alcohol use at school

To protect the health and well-being of students, the NCDSB will be installing sensors to detect vaping in schools. The Smoke-Free Ontario Act bans the use of any tobacco, nicotine, or e-cigarette (vape) on school property. Anyone under the age of 19 is prohibited from buying or possessing alcohol or cannabis. These substances, and any illegal drug, are prohibited on school property.

Communication Between Home & School—Questions, Concerns or Complaints

The Ministry of Education has given school boards new requirements on how to communicate with parents who have questions, concerns, or complaints. This information will also be shared on the Parents section of the Board website and school websites in time for the start of the new school year. The process is outlined below:

- Parents/guardians should expect a response to a concern within two business days.
- If parents have a question about a classroom-related matter, such as curriculum, homework, classroom behavior, or specific incidents, please contact the child's teacher.
- If the parent cannot resolve the issue at the classroom level and/or have a question about school procedures. extracurricular activities, or safety concerns, please contact the school Principal.
- For issues unresolved at the school level or issues related to Niagara Catholic policies, procedures, resource allocation, or other concerns, please contact the Superintendent of Education assigned to Notre Dame Catholic Elementary School.






DROP OFF & PICK UP INFORMATION

Kiss'n'Ride Drop-off

Students who are being dropped off at school by a parent or family member are to use the Kiss'n'Ride area, located in the parking lot closest to the gymnasium. When dropping off your child/children at Kiss'n'Ride, follow the flow of traffic and proceed up to where school staff are present and place your car in park. A staff member will be present to welcome and escort your child/children onto the walkway safely. There is no need to exit your vehicle. Please refer to the diagram for reference:



Back to School Bus Transportation Information

Finalized transportation information was made available to families on **Thursday**, **August 19**, **2024**. Final transportation details will be available on August 29 @ 10:00 AM. Please ensure the following:

- Visit <u>www.nsts.ca</u> and sign in to the secure parent portal for your child's student transportation information. To sign in to the portal you will need your child's Ontario Education Number (OEN) which can be found on their report card. While signed in, please subscribe to the delay and cancellation module for direct and timely emails regarding student transportation that impacts your child's bus route.
- Families who have not had their child ride a bus in the 2023-24 school year are asked to complete the Opt-In to Transportation form. That same form includes the option to Opt-out of Transportation for any student who does not require bus transportation this school year. August 30, 2024 is the last day for families to Opt-In to transportation to ensure their child can ride the bus for the first week of school. Students who rode the bus during the 2024-24 school year do not need to have an Opt-In to Transportation form completed.
- Unauthorized passengers (ie. Students who are not registered for transportation) will not be permitted to ride the bus.

Please contact your school or NSTS if you have questions regarding your child's transportation arrangements.

Emergency Medical Protocols

At Notre Dame, we work cooperatively with families in order to provide a safe, inclusive, and healthy educational environment for all students. We recognize that students who are at risk because of medical concerns such as **allergic reactions**, **diabetes**, **epilepsy**, **intolerances**, **asthma and/or seizures** require an intervention plan for their needs to be met and to reach their full potential at school.

If your child requires a specific plan of care, please contact the school at your earliest convenience so we can ensure his or her safety while in our care.

SchoolCash Online Payment for School Activities

As activities and educational field trips are being scheduled for your children, we ask that parents sign up for our convenient payment program, SchoolCash Online. This is an excellent way to pay for student activities without sending money to school.

School Messenger - Safe Arrival

One of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely to school each and every day. School Messenger allows parents to report their child's absence quickly and conveniently using the **mobile app**, a **website**, or an **interactive toll-free phone line** to report an absence, late arrival or early departure, in advance. This process allows the school to verify student attendance and notify parents of an unreported student absence efficiently.

If your child is marked absent and the absence hasn't been explained in advance, our SafeArrival system will contact you to get a reason for the absence. Calls will continue until you choose an option to explain your child's absence. **PLEASE** using the the following information to report your child's absence: mobile app, online: https://go.schoolmessenger.ca/#/home or by calling 1-844-287-6287. It is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Student Aware Internet Filter

This is just a reminder to families that all Niagara Catholic schools use a software program called "Student Aware". This program enables schools to monitor its student internet traffic while using Board internet devices. The "Student Aware" program will be identifying and notifying school staff when students access online websites related to suicide, violence, abuse and/or other dangerous activities that could be injurious to themselves and/or others. When high-risk incidents are identified, the occurrence will be investigated and school administration will respond accordingly to support student mental health and well-being.
