The beginning of each day is an important time for students to transition into the building and begin learning. Please ensure that your child is at school for the starting bell at 8:35. Before school supervision will begin at 8:20am. There will be no staff to supervise students prior to that time and we ask that students do not arrive before then.

ABSENT/LATE STUDENTS

The Safe arrival program is aimed at verifying the location and safety of each child in our school. Parents are asked to report their child's absences, lates, or early dismissals before the start of school. The system will call you repeatedly if your child is not present in school once the bell rings.

ANAPHYLAXIS

St. Christopher Catholic Elementary School promotes a healthy, NO NUT environment for the safety of our children. Parents are requested to not pack any foods that contain or may contain nut or peanut products in their children's lunch. Please give our children with anaphylaxis the same consideration that you would wish for your child's protection.

If you have a child with anaphylaxis to any allergens, please contact the office immediately so that we can work together to keep your child(ren) safe.

ASTHMA

If your child(ren) has asthma and requires an inhaler/puffer throughout the day, please let the school know immediately so that we can work together to keep your child(ren) safe.

MEDICATIONS IN SCHOOL

Parents should be aware of the strict guidelines established by the Niagara Catholic District School Board for medication in schools.

- 1. The medication must be in the container prepared by the pharmacist and the label must include: the name of the doctor, student and the name and strength of the medication.
- The school must have a written request from the physician indicating the frequency and dosage of the prescribed medication (this form is available at the school).
- Deliver prescribed medication directly to the school office. Please do not send them with the child.

ORANGE SHIRT DAY/EVERY CHILD MATTERS

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in the spring of 2013. It grew out of Phyllis' story of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an opportunity to keep discussions on all aspects of residential schools happening annually.

Orange shirt day across Canada is held on September 30. It was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their

homes to residential schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year. It also gives teachers time to plan events that will include children, as we want to ensure that we are passing the story and learning on to the next generations.



INDIGENOUS EDUCATION - VOLUNTARY SELF IDENTIFICATION

Under Ontario's First Nations, Métis, and Inuit (FNMI) Education Policy Framework, Niagara Catholic encourages all Indigenous students to self-identify as part of a VOLUNTARY AND CONFIDENTIAL process. Niagara Catholic uses information gathered from the self-identification process to support Indigenous students through:

- Accessing culturally relevant materials and programs in schools, allowing Indigenous students to see themselves reflected in the learning materials.
- Gathering academic information to support the unique learning needs of Indigenous students within our schools.
- Accessing cultural events offered to Indigenous students throughout the school year.
- Hosting special events at our schools, allowing our Indigenous students to share their unique cultural identity with non-Indigenous students.
- Sharing information about career and educational funding opportunities that are specific to Indigenous students.

MOBILE DEVICES IN SCHOOLS

In an effort to cut down on distractions in the classroom, mobile devices such as cellphones will now be prohibited from the classroom unless specifically directed by the teacher for instructional purposes, as part of a Individual Education Plan or if it is being used in conjunction with a medical device (ie. to monitor glucose levels).

If a child from Kindergarten to grade 6 is using a mobile device, they will be directed to the principal's office to place the device in a secure location for the remainder of the instructional day. If a student in grade 7 & 8 is using for anything other than instructional purposes, they will be directed to place the device in a secure location directed by the teacher.

STANDARDIZED DRESS CODE POLICY

The Niagara Catholic Elementary Standardized Dress Code Policy for all students from kindergarten to grade 8 has been revised. Please familiarize yourself with the revisions and also the dress code compliance. The policy and a description of the dress code items is easily accessed at www.niagaracatholic.ca and can be found below.

Compliance with the Niagara Catholic Elementary Standardized Dress Code Policy and Administrative Guidelines is a condition of registration and attendance in an elementary school within the Niagara Catholic District School Board.

The elementary standardized dress code requires that all students arrive at school daily and/or for special school related community events dressed in the required elementary standardized dress code.

Compliance by all elementary students registered with Niagara Catholic is expected as determined by the Principal. Students who do not comply with the elementary standardized dress code expectations will be consequenced according to school and policy guidelines.

If your child(ren) have outgrown any of their dress code clothing and you would like to donate to other families in the school community, you can send these clean, good condition items to the school. We will ensure that they go to other families who may need them. Once we have these items we will make them available in the office and will let families know that we have them.

PARKING LOT SAFETY

Please drive with caution in the parking lot and near the school. We have many students who are being dropped off and picked up at the same time. They are all at varying places on their learning journey and may not always remember to look both ways before stepping out into traffic. Please exercise extra caution when driving in the school parking lot.

We would greatly appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that your child arrives at school on time each day and staff are on duty at 8:20 am.

CONCUSSION PROTOCOL

The Niagara Catholic District School Board recognizes concussions as a serious injury which requires appropriate follow-up measures to reduce the risk of potential additional injury. Concussion awareness, prevention, identification and management are a priority for the Board. The implementation of the Board's Concussion Administrative Operational

Procedures is another important step in creating healthier schools in the Niagara Catholic District School Board

If staff, in communication with the school principal, suspects head trauma or a concussion might be possible based on signs and symptoms reported by the student, they are required to complete the appropriate documentation, call home and send home a copy of the documentation.

Medical doctors and nurse practitioners are the only healthcare professionals in Canada with licensed training and expertise to diagnose a concussion; therefore, all students with suspected concussions should undergo evaluation by one of these professionals.
