MATH CORNER

The following are important tips for Family Math Activities, from Dr. Jo Boaler:

- Play games and puzzles with your children
- Never share with children that you were "bad at math" or that you disliked math.
- Encourage children to explain their thinking and listen to their reasoning. It is important for adults to try to find the logic in what they are thinking

Playing Math games at home will allow students to realize that Math is fun in all areas of their life!

LITERACY CORNER: WHAT IS PHONEMIC AWARENESS?

Phonemic awareness is the ability to manipulate individual sounds in our language. (ex: taking the word cat and being able to say the sounds c-a-t.) If we can teach children to play with sounds, and then teach them the letters that go with those sounds, it will help them become successful readers! To build your child's phonemic awareness, play with sounds!

1. Say the sounds in a simple word (mat, top, etc) and ask them to put the sounds together to tell you the word.

2. Do the reverse! Tell your child a word, and ask them to tell you the sounds.

3. If your child is struggling to do this out loud, use blocks, chips or coins to represent each sound. Have them touch a block for each sound in the word.



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
