

School, Home and Parish



Grade 8 Graduation - Wednesday, June 18, 2025 at Club Roma. Information to follow later.



SafeArrival:

To report your child absent prior to the start of the school day (before 8:25 a.m. of the day being called in for), please use one of the 3 methods listed below:

- 1. Use the SafeArrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account using your email address. After logging in, select the Attendance tab to Report an Absence.
- 2. Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app (blue logo) from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). Use your new login information to access your account. Select Attendance to Report an Absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications on your mobile device please



enable Push Notifications in the Settings area of the app. The document Using the SchoolMessenger app will give instructions for using the App.

3. The toll-free number 844-287-6287 will allow you to report your child absent without creating an account.

Still Waiting For a Few Signed Permission Notes Off of School Cash On-Line

Dear Parents of Students in Grade 4 - 8,

This year, and every year hence forth, we are asking parents to sign off on the NCDSB Elementary Participation/Acknowledgment of risk form before any interschool sport can be played. This would include all sports and intramurals.

Intramural activities are defined as school-sponsored physical/recreation activities that occur outside the student's instructional time and are not competitions against other outside teams/groups. They may include Sports Games and Sport Imitations, Low Organization Activities, Drop-In Physical Activities, and some Special Events and Clubs.

Elements of Risk: In all physical activities there is an element of risk. Accidents/injuries may result from the nature of the activity and can occur without any fault on either the part of the student, or the school board or its employees or agents or the facility where the activity is taking place. Injuries may range from minor sprains and strains to more serious injuries (for example, concussion). Participants assume this risk but reduce the chance of an accident/injury occurring by carefully following instructions at all times during the activity.

EQAO Results

This month, Grade 3 and 6 parents and guardians will receive their child's Individual Student Report (ISR). This report contains their child's results from the Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, Primary and Junior Divisions, administered in spring 2024. These results did not impact students' report cards last year.

EQAO results offer an independent snapshot that shows whether students are meeting literacy and math expectations from *The Ontario Curriculum*. In receiving the ISR, there is an opportunity for parents and guardians to have discussions about their child's achievement within their family or with a teacher (e.g., parent/guardian-teacher interview).

EQAO data should be considered alongside other information—such as in-class assessment results, report-card grades and teacher observations—so parents and guardians can build a fuller understanding of their child's learning.

Fire Prevention Week™ (FPW™) is October 6-12, 2024

Fire Prevention Week is a nationally observed week in the <u>United</u> <u>States</u> and <u>Canada</u> from the Sunday to Saturday in which October 9 falls.



In the United States, the first <u>Presidential Proclamation</u> of the week was made in 1925 by <u>Calvin Coolidge</u>. Since then, the parent organization of the <u>Fire Marshals</u> <u>Association of North America</u> who first created the week, the <u>National Fire Protection Association</u> (NFPA), continues to be the international sponsor of it.

In Canada, the week is proclaimed annually by the <u>Governor General</u>. The Saturday at the end of the week is also proclaimed as "**Fire Service Recognition Day**" to express appreciation for the many public services of the Canadian fire service.

This year's FPW campaign, "Smoke alarms: Make them work for you!™" strives to educate everyone about the importance of having working smoke alarms in the home.

With support of our Fire Department, we will be conducting a fire drill on Tuesday, October 8th.

Dental Screening - November 22, 2024



Niagara Region Public Health Dental Program will be offering <u>dental</u> <u>screening</u> to grades JK, SK, 2, 4 and 7 on Friday, November 22, 2024.

A registered dental hygienist will take a quick look in the child's mouth using a sterilized dental mirror and light.

The <u>Healthy Smiles Ontario</u> program may financially assist children who do not have access to dental care.

If you do not want your child(ren) to take part in the dental screening, you MUST complete the online <u>School Dental Screening Opt-Out Form</u> or call the Dental Health Line at 905-688-8248 or 1-888-505-6074 ext. 7399 each school year.

If your child(ren) is not in one of the grades listed above, they may have the opportunity to participate in the dental screening. If you would like your child to be screened, please complete the <u>School Dental Opt-In Form</u>.

Kindergarten Free Fluoride

Niagara Region Public Health Dental Program will be visiting our school on **November 22, 2024** to provide FREE fluoride varnish to JK/SK students. This service is recommended to keep teeth healthy and help prevent cavities. Your child may be eligible for dental services through <u>Healthy Smiles Ontario</u>.

PPM 128 Cell Phone Use in Schools

Dear Parent/Guardian(s),

Elementary

As we continue to foster a safe and positive learning environment for all students, I would like to remind you of the new regulations regarding cell phone use that have been implemented in Ontario schools.



To minimize distractions and maximize learning, cell phones are only permitted during instructional time when they are being used for educational purposes as directed by the teacher. Outside of these times, students are expected to keep their phones turned off and stored away unless needed for documented learning needs and/or health related requirements. We kindly ask for your support in reinforcing this policy with your children and encouraging them to focus on their studies during school hours.

Your cooperation is essential in helping us maintain a healthy and respectful school environment. If you have any questions or concerns regarding these rules, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Thank you for your understanding and support.

Please note that all cell phones need to remain in backpacks or lockers. If your child does have a locker, it is suggested that s/he bring a lock. Cell phones are not to be kept in back pockets, in the pouch of hoodies, in desks, or anywhere visible.

If a child does have his/her cell phone out, they will be directed by the classroom teacher to go to the office where the phone will be locked in the safe. The cell phone will either be returned at the end of the day, or will be returned to the parent/guardian when they come to pick it up. Thank you

Elementary Dress Code

NCDSB has a dress code of <u>navy and white</u> for all Elementary schools and their students within. Below is an excerpt from the Elementary Standardized Dress-Code Policy 302.6.10:

1.1 At a minimum, every student is required to wear one of the following items: $\[mathbb{I}\]$ Navy Blue sweat pants for students in



Kindergarten to Grade 3; Navy Blue Pants (Cargo, Corduroy, Denim, Dress, Kobe styles permitted); Navy Blue Dresses or Skorts; or Navy Blue Capris or Walking Shorts. Grade 8 students have the option to wear grey secondary uniform pants purchased through Board uniform suppliers. Pants, skirt or dress length must be appropriate and modest. Only knee length capris or shorts are permitted. All clothing must be in good repair.

1.2 At a minimum, every student is required to wear one of the following items:

Navy Blue or White Oxford shirt (short or long sleeve);
Navy Blue or White Polo shirt (short or long sleeve); or
School designed spirit wear polo shirt. The elementary standardized dress code shirts, either polo

or oxford must be buttoned in a respectable manner. Visible t-shirts worn under the elementary standardized dress code top must be either navy blue or white. In addition, approved sweaters and hoodies embroidered and/or screened with the school logo are permitted to be worn as part of the elementary standardized dress code.

Orders placed through Big Bear Spiritwear can either be picked up at their Niagara Falls store or can be delivered to the school for a \$3.00 charge. Items delivered to the school will be sent home with the student in his/her backpack.

Anaphylaxis Awareness

All schools within Niagara Catholic are <u>peanut and tree nut free.</u>
At St. Nicholas Catholic, we have students with a life threatening allergy (anaphylaxis) to peanut and/or tree nut products. We ask that you please read labels carefully ensuring that all lunch products are peanut and tree nut free. That includes products that





'may contain' or are packaged in a facility that uses peanuts and/or tree nuts. For more information on anaphylaxis, visit www.anaphylaxis.ca.

We work very hard at preventing accidental exposure. We ask that you please ensure that your child has thoroughly washed his or her hands after eating peanuts or peanut products for breakfast/lunch while at home. It is also very important that we have common rules throughout the school. The teachers will explain the importance of the following health and safety routines to the students in their classrooms:

- 1) Wash hands with soap and water/hand sanitizer before and after eating,
- 2) Do not bring in food that contains, or possibly contains peanuts/tree nuts
- 3) Do not share food with other students
- 4) Do not accept food from other students, especially if you have an allergy
- 5) Dispose of all food waste properly

If your child has an allergy or is anaphylactic, please ensure that the office is aware and that the proper medical forms have been completed. All medication signed off on by a doctor will be housed safely at the school during the duration of the school year. Please check the expiration date of all medication prior to bringing in.

Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools

Ryan's Law (Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools) 2015 is an important step to support the health and well-being of students diagnosed with asthma in Ontario schools.



If your son/daughter has been diagnosed with asthma, please contact the office to provide information about your son/daughter's asthma medication.

You will be required to complete and submit the Niagara Catholic Student Asthma Management Plan for your student.

Any student under the age of 16 years will be permitted to carry and administer his/her asthma medication at school with your consent. A student 16 years or older is not required to have his or her parent's or guardian's permission to carry his or her asthma medication.


