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Classroom Spotlight Grade Three Grade 3 Adventures!

What an exciting start to our school year! Our Grade three classroom has been buzzing with activity and growth as we work on building independence in following our daily routines. From the end of October through November, we've enjoyed a variety of engaging learning opportunities in Literacy, Numeracy, Religion, and Social Studies.

In Literacy, our young writers have been busy crafting descriptive writing pieces about Halloween settings and characters, diving into the writing process during our Writer's Workshop periods. Daily reading is a key part of our routine, and we've been growing as readers through independent, shared, and guided reading. Word study has been a highlight, as students learn the fascinating 'secret stories' that explain sound behavior, helping us decode new words in both reading and writing.

In Social Studies, we've been exploring Ontario and its communities, gaining a greater appreciation for our province. Meanwhile, in Math, students have been reviewing and discovering new concepts through hands-on activities and technology-based learning. Daily number talks help us visualize problem-solving, apply higher-level thinking, and build flexibility in our strategies. Whether representing numbers, exploring patterns, or diving into measurement, our mathematicians are hard at work!

Our Religion class has been a meaningful space for reflection and celebration. Students were especially engaged while learning about All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, exploring the lives of Saints and honoring them through classroom prayer. As Advent approaches, we are eager to continue our faith journey together.

Grade 3 truly is a year of discovery, growth, and joy, and we're so proud of the effort and enthusiasm our students bring to each day.

Anaphylaxis Awareness and Action Plans



All classrooms at St. Theresa are <u>peanut</u>, <u>tree nut and milk safe classrooms</u>. No peanuts, peanut products, or tree nuts are allowed at any time. We have many students with life threatening allergies to peanuts, tree nuts and peanut products. Please do not send in any food items for class

distribution. We also have a student with dairy allergies and must ensure we handle all dairy food items carefully.

Students who share the classroom with our student with a dairy allergy have been informed and know that they are to wash their hands after lunches and snacks that contain dairy items. Please ensure that your child has thoroughly washed their hands after eating peanuts, peanut products or dairy products for breakfast/lunch at home. We must make every effort to ensure we do not contaminate our learning environment for these students. Please respect the safety of all students. Remember how you would want your child protected by their school community if your child had a fatal allergy.

Medication

For safety reasons, no child is to bring any form of medication to school. If medication is necessary, there is a form that must be filled out by your doctor to indicate dosage, instructions, etc., and the prescription container clearly labeled with names (child, parent, doctor), phone numbers and must be left at the office. Please contact the school to address individual student needs in this regard.
