DISMISSAL REMINDERS

Out of much care for the safety of students and their parents, we would like to provide a friendly reminder with respect to the dismissal procedure. Parents picking up their child(ren) will continue to meet their child(ren) at the **east field** during dismissal. Please know that parking spaces in our parking lot are limited; therefore, parents are encouraged to arrive early and park at the church that is next door to the school as there is ample space there.

Parents are reminded to please use the sidewalk when walking to and from the east field, regardless of whether they parked their vehicle at the school or church next door. Please know that walking across the parking lot, especially with children, is not advised as this presents a great concern for safety with vehicles coming in and out. In addition, once the snow arrives and the parking lot is plowed, there will be snowbanks along the edge where the east field and parking lot meet. Again, we remind families to please be safe and utilize the sidewalk. We thank everyone for their continued support and flexibility and for working with the school as we endeavour to keep everyone safe. Please know that we will communicate with families via School Messenger should the dismissal procedure need to be adjusted in any way to account for the challenges of winter.

INCLEMENT WEATHER PROCEDURE

As the winter months approach, we would like to take this opportunity to review the



 Procedure:
If bus transportation is cancelled in the morning, it means that the children will not be picked up at the end of the day. If you drive your child to school

on the day transportation is cancelled, it is then your responsibility to pick your child up at the end of the day.

When transportation services are cancelled, only the school remains open, and it is the responsibility of the parent to determine whether or not it is safe for their child to attend school.

If your child is not coming to school, please report the absence using Safe Arrival System.

- 2. Procedures Relating to Inclement Weather AFTER the School Day starts in this case either:
- a) Transportation is cancelled and school is kept open.
- b) Transportation is cancelled and the school is closed.

The safety of our children is our primary concern; the school will attempt to contact you by phone should an emergency closing be necessary after children have arrived at school. This will be done solely for the purpose of informing you that classes have been cancelled. The option you, as a parent, have chosen on the Emergency School Form will apply to all emergency dismissals. If this form has yet to be completed, please be sure to do so and send it to your child's teacher.

French Immersion for September 2025

The Niagara Catholic District School Board is proud to offer parents and students the opportunity to enroll in a French Immersion (FI) Program. This program is designed specifically for students whose first language is not French. French Immersion in the Niagara Catholic District School Board is an **optional** program.

All 5 French Immersion Catholic Elementary Schools will accept registrations for Grade 1 along with Kindergarten for September 2025.

Transportation

All students enrolled in the French Immersion Program will be provided with transportation to their local Family of Schools designated French Immersion School site in accordance with the Board's Transportation of Student Policy #500.2. Designated Family of Schools French Immersion schools can be located at the following link www.niagaracatholic.ca.

French Immersion On-line Open Pre-Registration

- ⇒ On-line open pre-registration window for students new to French Immersion in September 2025: Monday, January 13th, 2025 at 7:30 a.m. through to Friday, January 31st, 2025 at 4:00 p.m.
- \Rightarrow Pre-registrations outside of this window will not be considered.
- ⇒ There are a limited number of spots available for students wishing to enter the French Immersion Program.
- \Rightarrow Pre-registrations are on a first come, first serve basis. Each pre-registration will receive a time-stamp.
- ⇒ Please visit <u>www.niagaracatholic.ca</u> and click the first thumbnail-Registration. Then, click the Let's get you registered! link at the bottom of the page.
- \Rightarrow An account must be created first through edsembli CONNECT to access the registration forms. This account can be created ahead of time.

Selection Process

In accordance with the Board's Admission of Elementary and Secondary Students Policy #301.1, there are a limited number of spots available for students entering the program. Eligible spots will be determined on a first come, first serve basis for each elementary French Immersion school site. Applicants will receive notification by Monday, March 3rd, 2025 to inform them if their children have been placed in the French Immersion program OR if their children have been placed on the school's waitlist. Applicants who have not received notification by March 3rd, 2025 are to contact the elementary French Immersion school site directly.
