French Immersion Sibling Registration

Families who already have a child or children in the Niagara Catholic District School Board's French Immersion Program are invited to complete the ADVANCE_<u>SIBLING</u> REGISTRATION for their child who wishes to enter as a new student to the French Immersion Program at the site specific, grade-level appropriate entry point in September 2025.

Online registration will take place using the EDSEMBLI Parent Portal platform (the same one used for viewing report cards). As this is an updated platform, parents will require more time to complete the registration, as more information is needed. (i.e home address, emergency contacts etc.).

Parents are advised to go onto the report card site (Niagara Catholic Parent Portal at www.niagaracatholic.ca >> Parents>> Report Cards >> Elementary School >> Alexander Kuska) to create their account, if they have not created one or to verify your existing account, prior to December 4th.

French Immersion On-line Open Pre-Registration

On-line open pre-registration window for students new to French Immersion in September 2025 will open in approximately mid-January. The dates will be shared once they are available.

- There are a limited number of spots available for students wishing to enter the French Immersion Program. An account must be created first through Edsembli to access pre-registration forms.
- Pre-registrations are on a first come, first serve basis. Each pre-registration will receive a time-stamp.

We strongly recommend you provide your child with a separate bag in which they can transport their skates, helmet and gloves as the blades of the skates are sharp.


All vaccines for children under 18 years of age must be <u>reported to Public Health</u>. Every time your child receives a vaccine, you must report it:

Please note, you do not need to report any COVID-19 or influenza (flu) vaccination details.

HOLIDAY EXPECTATIONS
