#### MATH CORNER

## **Counting principles: One-to-One Correspondence**

Understanding that each object in a group can be counted once and only once. It is useful in the early stages for children to actually tag or touch each item being counted and to move it out of the way as it is counted.

In order for children to understand and apply the one-to-one counting principle, they must be able to orally count by rote. We can promote the development of this skill by regularly counting items during play and everyday life. Encouraging children to show quantities on their fingers is also helpful.

Strategies that Support Learning:

- Encouraging children to "tag" or move items out of the way while counting.
- Matching items with pictures. For example, using search and find books.
- Encouraging children to create a tally chart to count and track the quantity of food, toys, sounds (i.e.: taps on a drum), letters in a word or words in a sentence.
