Classroom Spotlight: Grade Four

Our Grade Four class is as busy as ever this month! As our students are settled in and preparing for the second term, it is clear everyone has transitioned to a junior student! Students are working on using the online EDWIN resource in their study of rocks and minerals, and well as exploring the regions of Canada. They are currently investigating how rocks and minerals are used in our world and how we extract them from the earth. To develop their critical thinking skills and sense of global citizenship, we are identifying pros and cons of extraction processes. As we continue to study topics this term such as light and sound, pulleys and gears, and early civilizations, we will take on the same approach to strengthen these skills.

We are continuing to incorporate word study in our daily work to teach and reinforce letter/sound relationships. Studying and reviewing the Words of the Week at home will support this as well. Our upcoming topics in Literacy are learning about point of view in reading and writing, as well as inferring when reading.

In Math, students will be continuing to build on their multiplication and division skills when 2-digit numbers are multiplied. Through daily math talks, students are exposed to different ways to approach problems. Also, students can access NCVLE at home for extra practice using MathUp student links, as well as reviewing any posted work at any time! Special congratulations to Chilotam and Raymond for achieving Mathlete status on Knowledgehook - way to go!

Students have also been studying what it means to be a saint in the Catholic Church and how saints are important in our lives. They have researched many saints such as St. Nicholas, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Patrick and St. Valentine. We will continue to look to these saints for inspiration in our lives. Our Grade Four students continue to grow and learn, as they work on positive interactions and developing a caring classroom community!

All classrooms at St. Theresa are peanut, tree nut and milk safe classrooms. No peanuts, peanut products, or tree nuts are allowed at any time. We have many students with life threatening allergies to peanuts, tree nuts and peanut products. Please do not send in any food items for class

distribution. We also have a student with dairy allergies and must ensure we handle all dairy food items carefully.

Students who share the classroom with our student with a dairy allergy have been informed and know that they are to wash their hands after lunches and snacks that contain dairy items. Please ensure that your child has thoroughly washed their hands after eating peanuts, peanut products or dairy products for breakfast/lunch at home. We must make every effort to ensure we do not contaminate our learning environment for these students. Please respect the safety of all students.

Cell Phone use for Students

The Ministry of Education has directed schools and school boards to not allow elementary students to have cell phones on them during the school day. To fairly manage this mandate along with parenting decisions made for each of our students; we thank you for respecting the following compromise. If you are providing your child(ren) with a cell phone as part of their communication and safety tools as they transit from home to school and back, be advised that all cellphones will be placed in the classroom "cell garage" or in each student's backpack for the instructional day. If you are texting your child during the day, please expect them to only get the message at dismissal time 2:50 p.m. All communication must go through the main office during the school day. If students are using their cells as a personal device for research, teachers will direct them to access their cell phones. If students are required to bring a device for a specific purpose, the teacher will send a message in their digital platforms, such as the "NCVLE-classroom, School Messenger" so parents are aware of the request. Thank you for your support.

Medication

For safety reasons, no child is to bring any form of medication to school. If medication is necessary, there is a form that must be filled out by your doctor to indicate dosage, instructions, etc., and the prescription container clearly labeled with names (child, parent, doctor), and phone numbers and must be left at the office. Please contact the school to address individual student needs in this regard.

Parking Lot Safety



Parents are cautioned when driving in and out of the school parking lot. Students who walk to school may be crossing the driveway to get to the sidewalk. Student safety is our first priority and we ask that drivers please be vigilant.

If you are picking your child(ren) up at our "Kiss and Ride", we ask that everyone keep the traffic flowing in this space at a slow speed to ensure students are safe. It is preferred that you park your vehicle in the parking lot and escort your child(ren) to the front of the school during morning drop off and repeat the same procedure at the end of the day by meeting your child (ren) at the exit gates. **Do Not park** in the "Kiss and Ride" and leave your vehicle. Thank you, safety of our children is our first priority.
