








March Reflection

We will be doing some early Spring cleaning this week so we are asking students to please bring home all belongings from their lockers as well as performing a thorough desk cleaning. We want to thank Mrs. Dunkley, Miss Cousineau and coach Dakota for all their efforts in preparing our Intermediate Girls' and Boys' Basketball teams for their Niagara Catholic tournaments this past week. The students played with great effort and represented our school proudly. One host principal even contacted us to say what wonderful sportsmanship and respect our team displayed. Our Girls' team played to a hard fought final but just fell short and brought home a silver medal. Excellent job ladies. Our Boys' Team also made their way to the finals and were able to defeat their opponent, St. Edward, winning the championship. Great work gentlemen. We look forward to one more day of competition as both the Girls and the Boys will be participating in the Denis Morris Family of Schools Basketball Showcase and All-Star Game on Wednesday March 19, 2025. This Tuesday March 4, 2025 is Shrove Tuesday/Pancake Day/Mardi Gras/Fat Tuesday. It is the last day before we begin to prepare for the resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday. Traditionally it is the last day of feasting before we begin the Lenten Fast. Once again, this year we would like to thank the generosity of the Knights of Columbus and their volunteers for graciously providing pancakes for our students. Pancakes will be delivered throughout the morning beginning right after morning announcements. We will continue to serve until we get all of our students fed. We will begin with the younger students and work our way up to the Grade 8s. In keeping with our Eco Initiatives, we ask that students please bring in their own forks from home to help reduce the number of recycled materials required. Students can put them in their lunch bags or in a Ziploc bag for safe carrying and return home. Please do not send in any knives. Should our younger students have any gluten allergies or any allergy to any of the possible ingredients, please let their classroom teacher know by Monday, March 3, so we can plan accordingly. You may also wish to send in an alternative for them.

On Wednesday, March 5, Father Randy will join us in our gymnasium for an Ash Wednesday Liturgy and the distribution of ashes. The ashes are a symbol Catholics use to help them mark the first day of Lent and also to remember that we are all sinners but want to repent and return to God. Lastly, it is a reminder that we came from dust and to dust we will one day return. The distribution of ashes is not a sacrament and therefore all are welcome to receive the ashes if they come forward seeking them. If you wish your child to not participate, please let the classroom teacher know and they do not need to come up to receive them. Also, Tuck Shop which is usually held on Wednesdays will take place on Tuesday this week in order to help observe the solemnity of the day.

Lastly, as we mentioned in last week's update, some families will be getting a letter from Public Health informing them your child's immunization records indicate that they are not up to date on their vaccinations. The school also received a list of students in non-compliance with the policy. Please do not contact the school to notify us of any changes. You must contact Public Health immediately in order to find out what you must do next. Once they receive the information, they will update us daily. In order to avoid a suspension from school issued by Public Health, you must contact them. Only they can lift the suspension. All the information you require was in the letter you received in the mail from Public Health and the email sent out earlier this week by the school. Please look into this now to avoid any problems later on.


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Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC)
