PARKING LOT SAFETY

Thank you to all drivers who are dropping off and picking up students in the Kiss and Ride lane. Please **do not stop and park in this lane**. We must keep a continuous flow of traffic. The City of St. Catharines has issued a No Idling Order for all schools.

Thank you to those drivers who continue to be courteous when using our parking lot. Please note that cars are not allowed to drive or park in the bus lane. This is to ensure the safety of all children who exit the buses as well as those students crossing from the Kiss and Ride lane. Also, parents are asked to park in a parking spot, not in the driveway areas. These are no parking zones and cars may be ticketed by the by-law officer. Please continue to be cautious and aware as you enter and exit the parking lot. Please ensure that everyone who picks up and drops off your child(ren) is aware of the procedures in our parking lot.

Accessible Parking Spaces:

Drivers are kindly reminded to only park in the accessible parking spaces if they have a **valid permit displayed in the front window** of their vehicle. We thank everyone for respecting this expectation and for their ongoing cooperation.

YMCA Day Care Pick-Up:

Parents are reminded to please use a designated parking space when picking up students from the YMCA Day Care doors. Please be advised that the front lane is a fire lane and there is a sizable fine should a bylaw officer be present and issue a ticket.

Drop off tips:

For parents of older children, consider dropping your child off at the back entrance of the school on Northwood Drive or drop your child off at the short pathway on Royal Manor Drive. Supervision is available starting at 8:15 am. Please do not drop your child off prior to this time.

Parking tips:

Having trouble finding a parking spot? Consider parking next door at the Scottlea Gospel Chapel or across the street at Scottlea Presbyterian Church.


