### **Reflection #8**

In Mark's Gospel, we read about Jesus and the rich man, who asked what he had to do to inherit eternal life. The rich man explained that he had kept all the commandments, but "Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, 'You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me" (Mark 10:21).

The rich man chose not to follow Jesus because he loved his many possessions. Our hearts were made for God. In order to follow Jesus, we need to set aside the things that take His place in our hearts. Jesus wants to be the King of our whole heart, not just part of it. Like his call to the rich man, Jesus asks each of us to let go of everything that gets in the way of us following Him. ### **COBS Bread Fundraiser 2025**

Back by popular demand, our 4th Annual COBS Bread Fundraiser is underway! All funds raised will support the purchase of technology for our school. **This fundraiser will run until Thursday, April 24th**. Stamp cards will be distributed in early May.

The "Loaf per Month" Card entitles you to get one complimentary loaf of bread at COBS Bread Ridley Square every month for a year! The card is valid for one "Complimentary" loaf of any kind in the bakery every month for a year – (12 loaves in total). This card is only redeemable at the COBS Bread Ridley Square location in St. Catharines. The cost of the card is \$25. The school receives half of the proceeds from card sales.

### How does it work / Rules?

• The cardholder will come into the bakery every month and will choose any loaf available that day and will get it as a "Complimentary Loaf". Their card will be stamped at that time and they will not be charged for the loaf. The process will repeat itself every month until the card has been stamped for every month.

- Only **one** card can be used per person per day.
- If you miss a month and come into the bakery with a missing stamp, you will still get your free loaf for the missing month. All 12 months will be allowed to be redeemed.
- This card can only be used at the COBS Bread Ridley Square location in St. Catharines. **PRIZES**

The top-selling class will win a pizza party.

Every student who participates in the fundraiser will be entered in a draw to win one of 3 prizes of a free year end field trip. For every ten (10) cards a student sells, he/she will be entered in a draw to win a Nintendo Switch!
