Let's Fight Food Waste at Kuska!

This April, Alexander Kuska is launching a *Food Waste Awareness Campaign* to help reduce avoidable food waste and protect our planet. Did you know that nearly 60% of food in Canada is wasted—and much of it is still perfectly good to eat?



Avoidable food waste happens when we throw away food that could have been eaten, like uneaten snacks or not using all the edible parts of fruits and vegetables. When food ends up in landfills, it creates methane gas, a harmful greenhouse gas that contributes to climate change.

To take action, students and staff will be learning about the impacts of food waste and taking a *school-wide pledge* to reduce it. We'll be encouraging simple habits like packing only what you plan to eat and using up all the edible parts of your food.

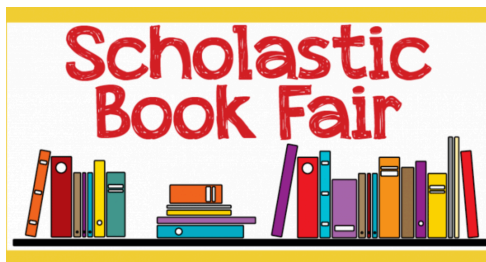

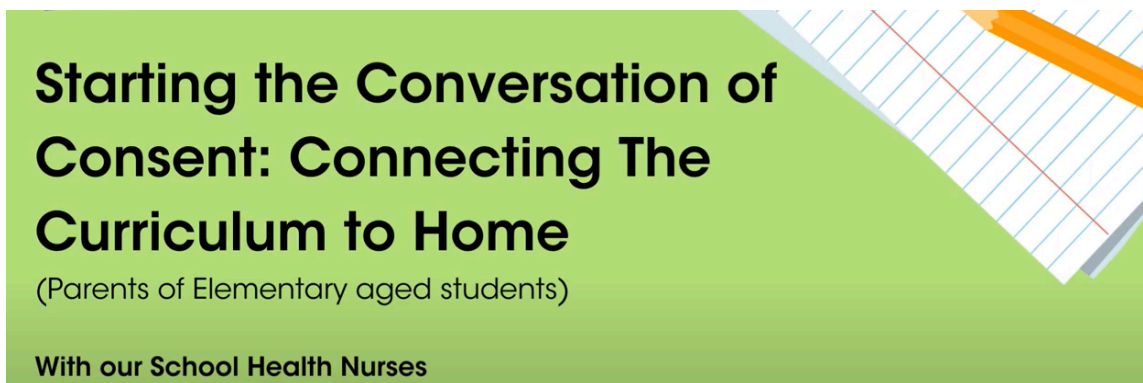
