




April Reflection

looking at him, loved him and said, 'You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the



Dear St. Anthony Family,



The journey to Easter is coming to an end. Soon we will all rejoice in the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. As we move closer to Sunday, this week we focus on those last days of his life. On Sunday Jesus enters into Jerusalem and is greeted by waving

palms and adoration. To help us prepare for the resurrection our Grade 3 students will be presenting the Stations of the Cross to our school in the gym at 11:45 am. Parents of the Grade 3 students are welcome to join us. Please sign in at the office and join us in the gym.

Next week our Grade 2 and 5 students will be travelling to the St. John Outdoor education Centre. The majority of the day is spent outside so we encourage you to pay close attention to the weather and dress appropriately. It may be muddy so we urge students to wear boots and splash pants if they have them. Have fun.

We will be conducting our last Lockdown Drill of the year on Wednesday afternoon. Students will be given direction regarding what they are expected to do. Those with sensitivity to the alarm will be forewarned so that they can prepare for the event. A letter outlining the process will be sent home next week, closer to the date.
