EQAO DIGITALIZED ASSESSMENTS

EQAO assessments are required under the Education Quality and Accountability Office Act, 1996. The EQAO Assessments in Reading, Writing, and Math are for Grade 3 and Grade 6 students participating in in-person learning. All students who are accessing the Ontario Curriculum are expected to participate in the assessments. Please know that the assessments will take place digitally, using school devices from *May 20 - 23 (Grade 3 students)* and *May 26 - 30 (Grade 6 students)*. It is essential that students are not absent or late during this time. Parents are asked to please try and coordinate any appointments for their child around EQAO testing periods. Parents are invited to connect with their child's classroom teacher or our Educational Resource Teacher, Mrs. Cargnelli, if they have any questions regarding the EQAO assessments.

SAFE ARRIVAL SYSTEM

To report your child absent, please use any one of the methods listed below:

- SafeArrival Website: Visit the website at <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create an account using your email address. After logging in, select the Attendance tab to report an absence.
- Personal Mobile Device: Download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store, the Google Play Store, or from the links at <u>https://</u> <u>go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>. Use your new login information to access your account. Select Attendance to report an absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications directly to your mobile device, please enable Push Notifications in the Settings section of the app. The document titled, <u>SchoolMessenger App Parent &</u> <u>Student User Guide</u> provides instructions for using the app.
- 3. **Standard Telephone**: The toll-free number **1-844-287-6287** will allow you to report your child absent without creating an account.

STUDENT ABSENCES & LATE ARRIVALS

It is essential that all student absences and late arrivals are called into the <u>Safe Arrival Program</u> by <u>8:30 am</u> via phone (1-844-287-6287), website or app. These are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You are also able to input future absences in advance if you are aware of an upcoming appointment or vacation. Board and Ministry policy dictates that we must investigate any unreported absences. This can involve calls to places of employment, the emergency numbers provided to the school and, in some cases, the police.



VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

School visitors continue to be restricted out of an abundance of care and consideration for the health, safety, and privacy of students and school staff. Essential items that must be dropped off are to be labelled clearly and can be placed on the cart to be retrieved by a designated staff member. On behalf of school staff, students, and families, thank you everyone for their ongoing cooperation with this very important matter.

STUDENTS DEMONSTRATING SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS

If a student becomes sick while at school, the identified emergency contact(s) on file will be called for immediate pick up. Parents and guardians of ill children are encouraged to contact Niagara Public Health and follow their advice. *Anyone who is sick should stay at home until their symptoms have resolved for 24 hours (48 hours for gastrointestinal symptoms)*. We thank everyone for their ongoing cooperation regarding this very important health and safety matter.

NUT ANAPHYLAXIS

The entire school community is working hard to prevent accidental exposure to products that trigger lifethreatening reactions. As a result, we continue to maintain a **PEANUT & NUT SAFE environment**. We would appreciate your cooperation in helping us keep St. John Catholic School safe, by making sure your children do not bring foods to school that may contain any traces of **peanuts** or **nuts**.



MILK ANAPHYLAXIS

Due to a number of students in our care who have a severe anaphylactic allergy to milk, it is asked that parents kindly refrain from sending milk to school with their child out of an abundance of care and consideration for the health and safety of these individuals. REMINDERS FOR ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

Kiss n' Ride Drop-Off: In an effort to keep our students and staff members safe, families are reminded that when using the Kiss n' Ride drop-off, *drivers are asked to please remain in their vehicle* and have child(ren) exit the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk when it is safe to do so. Supervising staff will be present in the parking lot at 9:10 am. Parents are kindly asked to please drop their child(ren) off *between 9:10 and 9:20 am*. We thank you for your support as we strive to welcome our students onto school property in an efficient, yet safe manner.

Kiss n' Ride Pick-Up:

To reduce congestion in the Kiss n' Ride line and along King Street, Kiss n' Ride students will be dismissed from their classrooms at <u>3:25 pm</u>. Parents are asked to please be at the school in a timely manner so students can be dismissed efficiently and without causing disruption to the flow of traffic on King Street.

Park & Pick-Up/Drop-Off:

Families of children in car seats who need to park their vehicles and walk their children to the school sidewalk are asked to please be mindful of oncoming traffic, which includes busses and Kiss n' Ride vehicles. For their own safety, families are reminded of the importance of utilizing designated walkways to access the sidewalks. To avoid congestion in the parking lot and to prevent a back-up of vehicles onto King Street, Park & Pick-Up students will be dismissed from their classes at <u>3:25 pm</u>.

- One-time registration students will automatically be moved between schools within our Board;
- Use of Google Translate in over 100 languages;

- Parent Help Desk Support is available 24/7.

HAND WASHING GUIDELINES

- 1. Clean your hands to prevent the spread of germs and reduce your risk of getting sick. Wash your hands after:
 - coughing or sneezing
 - blowing your nose
 - using the washroom
 - · playing with pets
 - playing outdoors
 - before preparing meals and eating
- 2. Use warm water and soap; lather and scrub for at least 20 seconds. Have children sing the ABC song, so they scrub for long enough. Alcohol-based sanitizers are safe for children and can be used when no dirt is present on their hands.

- ✓ Behaviour
- ✓ Gender balance

In all class situations, present and receiving teachers (if possible) meet with the Principal and Education Resource Teacher to make the final decision.

ONTARIO SPEECH & HEARING AWARENESS MONTH

Throughout the day you talk to family, friends, and colleagues. You use your hearing and speech all the time. You probably take them for granted. Imagine not being able to communicate simple thoughts like "Thank you" or "Tell me a story." For many Canadians with speech and language disorders, this is reality and a daily struggle. For them, words don't come easily. But when is the last time you really thought about it? **May is Ontario Speech & Hearing Awareness Month**, the perfect time to communicate some important information about hearing and speech.

Ontario Speech & Hearing Awareness Month is celebrated each May to raise public awareness of speech and language disorders that affect many Canadians. Speech and language disorders can take many forms and can limit academic achievement, social adjustment, and career advancement. An individual may be born with a speech or language disorder, or it may be caused by accidental injury or illness.

One in 10 Canadians has a hearing, speech, or language problem--a condition that makes it difficult to communicate with others. Anyone, of any age, can have or develop an impairment of the ability to hear, speak, or understand effectively. At any time, illness or accidental injury can impair your ability to hear and talk. Treatment to eliminate or minimize communication problems is available.

The early stages of communication disorders are easier to spot when you know the signs. Early detection can improve treatment and quality of life. Please visit <u>www.identifythesigns.org</u> for more information.

APRAXIA AWARENESS DAY - MAY 14

Apraxia of speech is a neurological motor speech disorder in which a child has difficulty rapidly, accurately and consistently producing and timing the movement sequences needed to produce speech. This is not due to weak muscles or paralysis. The child will know what he or she wants to say, but his or her brain has difficulty coordinating the muscle movements necessary to produce the words. In the province of Ontario, Apraxia Awareness Day has been proclaimed on May 14 of each year in an effort to help to raise awareness for this motor speech disorder. PPM 128 - CELL PHONE USE IN SCHOOLS

As we continue to foster a safe and positive learning environment for all students, please be reminded of the established regulations regarding cell phone use that have been implemented in Ontario schools. Please be advised that these regulations have been formally put in place by the Ministry of Education, since September 1, 2024.

To minimize distractions and maximize learning, cell phones are only permitted during <u>instructional time</u> when they are being used for <u>educational purposes</u>, as directed by the <u>teacher</u>. Outside of these specified and established times, students are expected to keep their phones *turned off* and *stored away in their backpacks*, unless needed for documented learning needs and/or health related requirements that have been pre-arranged with the school.

It is kindly asked that parents and guardians be supportive in reinforcing this policy with their child(ren).

Parent and guardian cooperation is essential in helping to maintain a healthy and respectful school environment. If parents or guardians have any questions regarding these rules, please do not hesitate to reach out to your child's classroom teacher.
