Supporting our Northern Neighbours in Need



In 2010, the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul (SSVP) took on the challenge initiated by Eileen Orysiuk and Sister Fay Trombley aimed at helping inhabitants of the Canadian Arctic in need. It all started in the community of Tuktoyaktuk, in the Northwest Territories.

Teams of Vincentian volunteers from the south help neighbours in need in 16 Northern Canadian communities whose needs continue to increase. They are assigned to a community, establish connections with the people and gain awareness of their requirements, allowing them to develop an accurate list of community needs and ensure equitable distribution of shipped goods.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul St. Catharines Central Council along with the respective particular councils and parish conferences across our Diocese have been helping with the North of 60 Project Naujaat Nunavut, also known as "Repulse Bay" for nine years, since 2016.

Repulse Bay is located north of Iqalit and Coral Harbour and has a population of 1000 people. 22% of the population is less than 20 years old and 40 - 50 babies are born annually. Families usually consist of mom, dad, 6 - 8 children and at least two elders. Residents in this community actively pursue hunting, fishing, and trapping to survive. There are 40 families in need of help this year. Each particular council and parish conference has been asked to donate various items in a rather large quantity in order to fill a 20 foot Sea container to be sent our in September 2025. The truth is that many conferences find themselves lacking resources to aid the poor in their own community.

St. Joseph School has been asked to help by donating Pasta to this cause.

Vision Health Month

Visual health is an important part of a child's overall health and well-being. Proper vision is important for a child's movement and coordination, independence, play and learning. If left untreated, vision problems may become serious and prevent a child from reaching their full potential.



A yearly eye exam is **FREE** – the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) covers the cost of an eye exam every 12 months for children up to the age of 19 with a valid OHIP

card. Find an eye doctor near you.

Also, contact an eye doctor if you see ANY of these signs:

 Squinting or holding objects close to the eyes 	One eye that turns out or in
Blinking often	 Rubbing, tearing, itchy or burning eyes
 Turning or tilting the head to the side often 	Reporting blurry or double vision
Covering or closing one eye	 Reporting headaches, nausea or eye strain

NEW Quit Vaping Program for Youth

The Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH) is excited to launch <u>Youth-Vaping</u>, <u>Substance use</u>, and <u>Technology (VAST</u>). Youth-VAST is a program for youth in Ontario who are using vaping, substances, or feel like technology is taking up too much

of their time. This program brings together existing and new resources across CAMH to deliver virtual services directly to youth and their family.



- Program offered for youth ages 12-21 years.
- · Appointments are offered virtually for youth all over Ontario
- Youth will be assigned a care coordinator to create a customized treatment plan
- Individuals can self-refer directly into this program, no physician referral required.




Lakeshore Catholic News

Today, multiple classes and members of LCHS Students' Council opened the Jubilee 2000 Time Capsule. This Time Capsule was created on December 23, 1999 at the turn of the century – many would remember this date as Y2K! Pope John Paul II commemorated Jubilee 2000 as a special period of celebration and spiritual renewal, marked by a theme and the opening of the Holy Doors in Rome, encouraging pilgrimage and forgiveness.
