DIRECT ENTRY

In an effort to ensure a seamless and safe start to each school day here at St. John, we will continue with our direct entry arrival for students. This means that students will be directed straight to their classrooms as soon as they arrive on school property. As a result, please be advised that **the school yard will not be open in the morning and no supervision will be provided outside to start the day.** We thank everyone for their cooperation with this very important health and safety matter.

SAFE ARRIVAL SYSTEM

To report your child absent, please use any one of the methods listed below:

1. **SafeArrival Website:** Visit the website at <https://go.schoolmessenger.ca>. The first time you use the website, select **Sign Up** to create an account using your email address. After logging in, select the **Attendance** tab to report an absence.
2. **Personal Mobile Device:** Download and install the **SchoolMessenger app** from the Apple App Store, the Google Play Store, or from the links at <https://go.schoolmessenger.ca>. Use your new login information to access your account. Select **Attendance** to report an absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications directly to your mobile device, please enable **Push Notifications** in the **Settings** section of the app. The document titled, [SchoolMessenger App Parent & Student User Guide](#) provides instructions for using the app.
3. **Standard Telephone:** The toll-free number **1-844-287-6287** will allow you to report your child absent without creating an account.

STUDENT ABSENCES & LATE ARRIVALS

It is essential that all student absences and late arrivals are called into the [Safe Arrival Program](#) by **8:30 am** via phone (1-844-287-6287), website or app. These are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You are also able to input future absences in advance if you are aware of an upcoming appointment or vacation. **Board and Ministry policy dictates that we must investigate any unreported absences. This can involve calls to places of employment, the emergency numbers provided to the school and, in some cases, the police.**

In keeping with Niagara Catholic's home school focus, we encourage all families to ensure that children are enrolled in their home school. This will allow students to establish and maintain meaningful relationships with other students who live in the heart of their community.

REUSABLE WATER BOTTLE

In an effort to promote and teach students about sustainability, we ask students to avoid bringing disposable plastic water bottles to school. Reusable water bottles can be filled at our hydration stations. Thank you for your co-operation and for your concern for the environment.

**NIAGARA STUDENT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES (NSTS)**

We invite all families who have children riding the bus to visit the [Niagara Student Transportation Services \(NSTS\) website](#) for the most recent updates on bussing. Parents are encouraged to log into the parent portal for specific information pertaining to run times and bus stop locations for their child(ren). Please be advised that NSTS has indicated that at times, school bus delays are possible and do happen, especially as routines are in the process of being established and when weather presents challenges. To receive notifications regarding delay alerts, families are invited to download the **BusPlanner Delay** app or subscribe for email alerts in the parent portal. Parents not wishing to receive notifications would be required to simply check in by visiting the '**Alert**' section of the NSTS website. **NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH & RECONCILIATION
ORANGE SHIRT DAY - SEPTEMBER 30TH**

September 30th has been declared the **National Day for Truth & Reconciliation** (formerly '**Orange Shirt Day**') throughout Canada in recognition of the harm done to generations of children by the Indian Residential Schools. As an affirmation of Niagara Catholic's commitment to ensure that **every child matters** as we continue on our reconciliation journey, the Niagara Catholic District School Board is acknowledging Orange Shirt Day on **Tuesday, September 30**. The origin of Orange Shirt Day is based on a story shared by a survivor of the residential school system, Phyllis Webstad, during the Truth and Reconciliation meetings held in Williams Lake, BC in 2013. In response, staff, students, and community members at St. John Catholic School are encouraged to come to school on **September 30** wearing the colour orange as a visible symbol in support of the notion that **every child matters** and that we are all called to love, respect, and care for one another as children of God.

RECESSES

As determined by the school's Joint Health & Safety Committee, St. John Catholic Elementary School will continue with its staggered recess structure due to limited space on the playground. Students will continue to have access to the field for unstructured play during recesses as much as possible. Please know that use of the field is determined based on its condition following wet weather. The school thanks everyone for their continued trust and support as we endeavour to maintain the health and safety of all.

VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

School visitors continue to be restricted out of an abundance of care and consideration for the health, safety, and privacy of students and school staff. Essential items that must be dropped off are to be labelled clearly and can be placed on the cart to be retrieved by a designated staff member. On behalf of school staff, students, and families, thank you everyone for their ongoing cooperation with this very important matter.

STUDENTS DEMONSTRATING SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS

If a student becomes sick while at school, the identified emergency contact(s) on file will be called for immediate pick up. Parents and guardians of ill children are encouraged to contact Niagara Public Health and follow their advice. *Anyone who is sick should stay at home until their symptoms have resolved for 24 hours (48 hours for gastrointestinal symptoms).* We thank everyone for their ongoing cooperation regarding this very important health and safety matter.

NUT ANAPHYLAXIS

The entire school community is working hard to prevent accidental exposure to products that trigger life-threatening reactions. As a result, we continue to maintain a **PEANUT & NUT SAFE environment**. We would appreciate your cooperation in helping us keep St. John Catholic School safe, by making sure your children do not bring foods to school that may contain any traces of **peanuts or nuts**.

**MILK ANAPHYLAXIS**

Due to a number of students in our care who have a severe anaphylactic allergy to milk, it is asked that parents kindly refrain from sending milk to school with their child out of an abundance of care and consideration for the health and safety of these individuals. Thank you to everyone for their understanding of this very important health and safety matter

**PREVALENT MEDICAL CONDITIONS**

If your child has a prevalent medical condition that the school should be aware of and plan for, it is necessary to read the letter to families, and complete and/or update the applicable Plan of Care forms. REMINDERS FOR ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

Kiss n' Ride Drop-Off: In an effort to keep our students and staff members safe, families are reminded that when using the Kiss n' Ride drop-off, *drivers are asked to please remain in their vehicle* and have child(ren) exit the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk when it is safe to do so. Supervising staff will be present in the parking lot at 9:10 am. Parents are kindly asked to please drop their child(ren) off *between 9:10 and 9:20 am*. We thank you for your support as we strive to welcome our students onto school property in an efficient, yet safe manner.

Kiss n' Ride Pick-Up:

To reduce congestion in the parking lot, Kiss n' Ride line, and along King Street, parents accessing the Kiss n' Ride lane are asked to please be at the school by *3:30 pm* to pick up students, so they can be dismissed safely efficiently and without causing disruption to the flow of traffic on King Street.

Park & Pick-Up/Drop-Off:

Families of children who require car seats and need to park their vehicles and walk their children to the school sidewalk are asked to please ensure that they park their vehicle in a *designated parking space*. Parking in non-designated areas creates congestion in the lot and could block emergency routes. In addition, parents are reminded to please be mindful of oncoming traffic, which includes busses and Kiss n' Ride vehicles. For their own safety, families are reminded of the importance of utilizing designated walkways to access the sidewalks. Parents who need to park their vehicle when picking up their child are asked to please be at the school by *3:30 pm*.

INDOOR & OUTDOOR FOOTWEAR

Parents are reminded to please consider sending their child to school with a pair of indoor running shoes. This will help to maintain everyone's health and safety by reducing potential for slipping hazards in our school. In addition, having a pair of indoor shoes for students to change into allows for cleanliness to be maintained in our building and for caretaking staff to focus on sanitization of surfaces and touchpoints. It is also advised that students wear *running shoes with proper ankle support* while at school to reduce risk of injury. Thank you to everyone for their cooperation with this health and safety matter.



ELEMENTARY STANDARDIZED DRESS CODE**Shirts:**

- Navy blue or white oxford-style long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirt.
- Navy blue or white polo-style long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirt.
- School-designed spirit wear including shirts, sweaters or hoodies.
- **All sweaters must be navy blue or white.**

Pants / Skirts:

- Navy blue sweat-pants for students in ELKP to Grade 3.
- Navy blue pants - Dress, Cargo, Denim, Kobe, Corduroy style.
- Navy blue skorts or dresses - length must be appropriate and modest.
- Navy blue walking shorts or capris or Grade 8 students have the option of wearing grey secondary uniform pants.

Shoes:

- We ask that parents/guardians please ensure that students come to school each day wearing appropriate and comfortable closed-toe footwear (i.e. running shoes with proper ankle support).
- Parents are asked to please send their child(ren) to school with a pair of indoor shoes and outdoor shoes. This will allow for cleanliness in our building and for caretaking staff to focus on sanitization of surfaces and touchpoints. **DIGITAL CONSENT FORM - NOTICE OF THE COLLECTION, USE AND DISCLOSURE OF STUDENT PERSONAL INFORMATION**

The Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (MFIPPA) requires school boards to obtain parent/guardian consent to release students' personal information to school volunteers, parishes, and the Niagara Region Public Health Unit. The Act also requires school boards to obtain consent to the disclosure of personal information, such as creative and academic accomplishments, images/videos/audio recordings, and/or accomplishments to be shared on school or Board websites, social media, or with the media. The digital form also addresses virtual learning in the 21st century.

Parents/guardians are asked to complete the most current ***Parent/Guardian Consent Form - Collection, Use and Disclosure of Student Personal Information*** (sent through ***'SchoolMessenger'***) by **September 18**.

STUDENT INFORMATION SHEETS

Please be advised that each student in the school will be receiving a hard copy of their personalized ***Student Information Sheet*** to bring home for review in September. It is asked that parents and guardians kindly review the information on the sheet, make any necessary revisions directly on the sheet, and return it to their child's classroom teacher as soon as possible. Please know that it is essential that there are at least ***two emergency contacts*** on file so that someone can be reached, should parents or guardians be unavailable in the event of an emergency. If there are any changes to this information that take place throughout the school year, it is asked that parents kindly contact the school to provide the update(s). Ensuring that accurate, complete, and current information is on file in our school records is essential to providing prompt care to students, especially in the event of an emergency.

RYAN'S LAW: ENSURING ASTHMA FRIENDLY SCHOOLS

Ryan's Law (Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools) is an important step to support the health and well-being of students diagnosed with asthma in Ontario schools. During this school year, the Niagara Catholic District School Board has created an Asthma Policy. If your son/daughter has been diagnosed with asthma, please contact the office at your school to provide information about your son/daughter's asthma medication. You will be required to complete and submit the Niagara Catholic Student Asthma Management Plan for your student. Any student under the age of 16 years will be permitted to carry and administer his/her asthma medication at school with your consent. A student 16 years or older is not required to have his or her parent's or guardian's permission to carry his or her asthma medication. The [Ministry of Education website](#) has resources on asthma, as well as other prevalent medical conditions. Families are encouraged to take time to read the content shared on the site. PPM 128 - CELL PHONE USE IN SCHOOLS

As we continue to foster a safe and positive learning environment for all students, please be reminded of the established regulations regarding cell phone use that have been implemented in Ontario schools. Please be advised that these regulations have been formally put in place by the Ministry of Education, since September 1, 2024.

To minimize distractions and maximize learning, cell phones are only permitted during **instructional time** when they are being used for **educational purposes, as directed by the teacher**. Outside of these specified and established times, students are expected to keep their phones **turned off** and **stored away in their backpacks**, unless needed for documented learning needs and/or health related requirements that have been pre-arranged with the school.

It is kindly asked that parents and guardians be supportive in reinforcing this policy with their child(ren).

Parent and guardian cooperation is essential in helping to maintain a healthy and respectful school environment. If parents or guardians have any questions regarding these rules, please do not hesitate to reach out to your child's classroom teacher.
