OFFICE and SCHOOL ARRIVAL/ LEAVING/VISITOR POLICY

St. Augustine has an intercom/surveillance system that allows us to increase student, staff and community safety.



Any student arriving after 8:35 a.m. must report to the office for a late slip. Attendance is taken promptly at the

start of the academic day. To decrease office calls home, we ask parents and caregivers to phone in absences and lates prior to the start of the school day.

- > Due to the population of the school and the special requirements for the students to organize themselves, we ask that parents wait outside at arrival and departure times.
- > Students will be met and supervised at all entry and dismissal times including morning bus arrival at 8:20 a.m.
- All students are required to remain at school during lunch period. Parents wishing to take their child off site at lunch must sign their child out at the office.
- Parents are asked to obey all parking signs (ENTER, EXIT) and to park only in designated areas. We ask for extreme caution while driving or parking near student exit doors.

We thank you for your understanding and cooperation. We believe these procedures will assist us in providing a safe and productive learning environment.

CATHOLIC SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

According to legislation, Catholic School Council elections are to be held in the first 30 calendar days of the school year.

I would encourage every parent in the St. Augustine Catholic School Community to consider being a member of the St. Augustine Catholic School Council. Through the council, community members can make a positive impact in the growth and development of the school community. It is one way of being an active partner in Catholic Education. PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

There is consistent evidence that parents' encouragement, interest, and participation affect their children's achievement. Students gain in personal and academic development if their families emphasize schooling, let their children know they do and do so continually over the years.

At. St. Augustine Catholic Elementary School, we ask that parents follow basic responsibilities in supporting the school and helping their children become successful learners.

- Be sure your child attends school regularly and arrives on time.
- Stay tuned in to what's happening at school and help your child with homework.
- If a problem arises, try to resolve it by following the chain of responsibility:
- -Classroom teacher
- -Principal
- -Superintendent

In order for us to be able to use every available moment for educating our students, we kindly ask parents to wait outside at dismissal time. Students have assigned entrance and exit doors.

SCHOOL ANNOUNCEMENTS/TIME ON TASK

Each morning commencement activities (Prayer, O Canada) will take place at approximately **8:40 a.m.**. It is our goal this year to maximize the use of instructional time during the school day.

Research has proven that the greater the time on task and instructional use of time, the greater the success rate of students.

QUESTIONS AND CONCERNS

Please call your child's teacher with any questions or classroom concerns you may have. A quick call can alleviate anxiety. Compliments are welcome! Feel free to contact the office regarding school policies and programs. I will be involved in classroom activities throughout the day. Therefore, it is best that if you wish to contact me, an appointment can be requested through our secretary at 905-734-4659. Please allow a 24 hour turn around for call backs. Appointments will be set up at

BULLYING / INTERNET (MSN)

Over the years, there has been a growing concern over school bullying across the country, province and communities. This is a complex social issue that involves all community members and can have serious negative implications for all involved.

As educators, we continue to be cognizant and sensitive to arising situations. We have gathered a great deal of resources on the topic and endeavour to be proactive in reducing bullying. Through social skills programs such as Fully Alive and our Religious Education program and St. Augustine Student Creed, we have made great progress at educating students and the many forms of bullying. The Niagara Catholic District School Board has developed a Bullying policy that can be found on the board website at www.niagararcatholic.ca

What can make the concept of bullying rebellious at times is the distinction between actual bullying and single breakdown in student relationships. We find that through open and honest discussion and ownership on the part of students involved we can distinguish the extent of the behaviour.

Cyber-bullying is yet another form of inappropriate behaviour that has seen a rising frequency. The school board and school have very strict rules of use during school time. These routines should be taken into account during home use. We ask that parents closely monitor their child's use of the computer.

In the event of any form of bullying (even when it has originated from inappropriate computer use in the home) the school will enforce appropriate consequences that may include school suspension.

CELL PHONE AND VAPING RULES REMINDER

As we continue to foster a safe and positive learning environment for all students, I would like to remind you of the new regulations regarding cell phone use that has been implemented in Ontario schools.

To minimize distractions and maximize learning, cell phones are only permitted during instructional time when they are being used for educational purposes as directed by the teacher. Outside of these times, students are expected to keep their phones turned off and stored away unless needed for documented learning needs and/or health related requirements. We kindly ask for your support in reinforcing this policy with your children and encouraging them to focus on their studies during school hours.

Your cooperation is essential in helping us maintain a healthy and respectful school environment. If you have any questions or concerns regarding these rules, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

RESPECTFUL INTERACTION

St. Augustine is rooted in Catholic and Christian values. Our goal is to create a safe, kind and loving environment for all who work, learn, and assist with our school community. Aggressive or hostile behavior or language toward staff, students or our community helpers will not be tolerated. While we welcome feedback, concerns and opinions it is the expectation that all staff, students, parents, guardians and community helpers communicate their needs and concerns with one another in a respectful and peaceful manner whether through email, on the phone or face-to-face. Adherence to this expectation is vital in order to create a community which can solve problems and help one another achieve success.

SAFETY & SUPERVISION

Yard duty supervision begins at 8:20 a.m. On days of inclement weather, students will be indoors for classroom supervision.

ADULT SUPERVISION DOES NOT BEGIN UNTIL THAT TIME.

FIREDRILLS

Fire drills must be conducted a minimum of six (6) times each school year, three per term at various times of the day. Our first fire drill will be conducted on Tues, September 10-weather permitting.

LOCKDOWN DRILLS

Lockdown drills must be conducted a minimum of twice. 1 per term. Our first lockdown will take place on **Thurs**, **Sept 18.**

TRANSPORTATION

Bus route information can be accessed through the NSTS (Niagara Student Transportation System) website at www.nsts.ca. Routes have been established according to home addresses. If you need to make changes to your child's bus schedule please contact Niagara Student Transportation services direct at 905-357-6787.

VOICEMAIL

Due to the school's fast paced day, callers may get the voicemail recording. Please leave your name, number, and the time of your call and a brief reason for your call. If the message is urgent, please continue to phone until someone answers. Calls will be forwarded to the appropriate staff member on the secretary's return to the office.

CASH ONLINE-PLEASE SIGN UP

St. Augustine is pleased to announce that we are currently still using "School Cash Online". With school cash online, parents have the convenient and secure option of paying for school items online, 24/7. To access online payments, please register at https://ncdsb.schoolcashonline.com; it takes less than 5 minutes. Registered parents can see their payment history, print receipts and receive email notifications whenever new student fees are posted. School cash online will limit the amount of cash and cheques handled in school, reduce paperwork and result in more focused instructional time in the classroom.

USE SCHOOL MESSENGER to REPORT your CHILD's ABSENCE

The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account using your email address. After logging in, select the Attendance tab to Report an Absence.

Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app (blue logo) from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). Use your new login information to access your account. Select Attendance to Report an Absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications on your mobile device please enable that in the Settings area of the app.

The current toll-free number 1-844-287-6287 will still allow you to report your child absent.

LATE SLIPS/ABSENCES

Students arriving at school after the bell must proceed directly to the office for a late slip. Students who proceed directly to class without obtaining a slip will be sent to the office for one. This procedure will ensure that your child's attendance is accurately documented. All students must endeavor to arrive at school on time for the entrance bell at 8:35 a.m.

If your child will not be in attendance, a call *must* be made to Safe Arrival, by calling 1-844-287-6287 or visit https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. We ask that you please report any absences by 8:35 a.m.. As well, if your child will be late and not in the classroom for the first period or afternoon attendance due to appointments or delays you must report their time missed to avoid unnecessary calls home in order to locate your child. This is a requirement under the Ministry of Education's "Safe Schools Policy" to maintain Safe Arrival and be able to discern as priority those children who may be in danger and whom should be reported missing.

MEDICATIONS IN SCHOOL

Parents should be aware of the strict guidelines established by the Niagara Catholic District School Board for medication in schools.

- 1. The medication must be in the container prepared by the pharmacist and the label must include: the name of the doctor, student and the name and strength of the medication.
- 2. The school must have written request from the physician indicating the frequency and dosage of the prescribed medication.
- 3. The school must have written permission from the parent or guardian to administer the medication (this from is available at the school office.)
- 4. Deliver prescribed medication directly to the school office. Please do not send them with the child.

N.B.: Contagious/infectious diseases, e.g. Chicken Pox or Fifth's Disease, must be reported to the school immediately.

ALLERGY ALERT

At the beginning of every school year we remind all students and parents/guardians of our Board's Anaphylaxis Policy. At St. Augustine we have Emergency Guidelines which clearly state what medical procedures must occur for those students who have various life-threatening medical conditions.

We are reminding all students and parents/guardians that we have students in our school who are known to have a potentially life-threatening allergy called Anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a severe life-threatening form of allergic reaction. It may begin with severe itching of the eyes or face, a sense of constriction in the throat, then other symptoms such as vomiting, diarrhea and difficulty with breathing may develop. This may lead to coma and death. Foods such as peanuts, other nuts, fish, shellfish, eggs, milk, and wheat as well as insect stings from bees and wasps, latex products and medication are the most common allergies that produce anaphylaxis.

Anaphylaxis requires immediate first aid response and immediate medical intervention. If your child has severe allergies, please inform the school secretary of this. We ask all parents for your cooperation in keeping our school a "nut-free" environment.

DRESS CODE POLICY

Students are reminded of our board dress code and the requirement is to be in full compliance daily.

ELECTRONIC POLICY

Personal cell phones, digital assistants (PDAs), audio or video recorders and players or other personal electronic devices are prohibited for use by students in all Niagara Catholic elementary and secondary schools unless specifically approved by staff for instructional or co-instructional purposes. Students are NOT to have cell phones out in class unless under the DIRECT supervision of their teacher. Students are not allowed to have their cell phones out at recess, in the hallways, or any other areas of the school. If students need to contact their parents at any time, they are ALWAYS allowed to call from the office. Parents, please support staff in adhering to these expectations. Students must remain focused during class to reach their potential. Thank you for your support.

The Board assumes no responsibility for the safety and security, loss, recovery, repair or replacement of a personal electronic device when carried on to Board premises. The secure storage of these devices is the sole responsibility of the owner/user.

VALUABLES AT SCHOOL

Children should not bring to school expensive articles of clothing, jewelry, shoes, toys, CDs, Laptops, I pads, I-Pods, cell phones, video games, etc. Occasionally things get ripped, stolen, and broken. At times it can be very difficult to determine who is at fault and to assess blame. Therefore, we ask that all of these items be left at home.

The school will not be held responsible for any damage to these personal items.

LOST AND FOUND

All student possessions should be labeled with their names in order to provide for easy identification if lost. A "Lost and Found" box is available and should be checked on a regular basis by students.

Students are advised to leave valuables, especially large amounts of money, at home. Unclaimed items are donated to Charitable Organizations.

WASTE FREE LUNCH CHALLENGE

FACT: School lunches are a major source of waste in Ontario with the average student's lunch generating a total of 30 kilograms of waste per school year, or an average of 8500 kilograms (18,700lbs) of waste per school per year.

GOAL: Each classroom reduces waste from school lunches and learns about the three R's-Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.

Take the WASTE FREE LUNCH CHALLENGE and reduce the amount of waste from lunches into the landfill.

Here are some things to look for in a waste free lunch:

- A reusable lunch bag or box (not a throw-away, single-use plastic or paper bag).
- Reusable containers for packing food (no plastic wrap, foil, plastic bags, single-serving containers, prepackaged foods). Hard plastic food containers or re-use of plastic tubs are suitable options.
- Reusable drink containers e.g. thermos, or reusable bottle (single-use pop cans, water bottles, juice boxes). Recyclable containers (pop cans) are discouraged, but acceptable as long as the student ensures they go into the recycling bin.
- Organic waste like apple cores, orange and banana peels, other leftovers etc. that can either be

composted through a school composting program or at home.

• Non-disposable cutlery (silverware) and a cloth napkin.
