

As we share the Good News of the Gospel with others, may our words and actions reflect the love that you have poured into our hearts.



Parish, School and Home

St Nicholas Catholic Elementary Schools is associated with the Cathedral of St. Catherine of Alexandria. Parish Rector is Father Ben Weber, Vice-Rector is Father McDonald.

Please note that school begins promptly at 8:35 a.m. Students who arrive after the 8:35 a.m. bell must report to the office for a late slip. Thank you for your continued support.

Arrival and dismissal of all Kindergarten students will take place from the Kindergarten gated area. Kindergarten students who are bussed, will be met by staff and safely walked from the bus to their gated area upon arrival. The reversal will happen upon dismissal.

All other students upon arrival to school will proceed to the back field.

To Report Your Child Absent, Please Do Not Call the School

SafeArrival:

To report your child absent prior to the start of the school day (before 8:25 a.m. of the day being called in for), please use one of the 3 methods listed below:

- 1. Use the SafeArrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account using your email address. After logging in, select the Attendance tab to Report an Absence.
- 2. Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app (blue logo) from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). Use your new login information to access your account. Select Attendance to Report an Absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications on your mobile device please enable Push Notifications in the Settings area of the app. The document Using the SchoolMessenger app will give instructions for using the App.
- 3. The toll-free number 844-287-6287 will allow you to report your child absent without creating an account.

What Happens If I Have To Pick My Child Up Early From School?

You can enter absences for the current school day in the SafeArrival system up to 8:25 a.m. If you know ahead of time that your child needs to leave early, please enter their early dismissal in the SafeArrival system. This way your child will be at the office ready and waiting. If you come to the school without prior notice, please ring the buzzer and Mrs. Winstanely will assist you.

Kiss And Ride: Please Park Only In A Designated Parking Spot

Please remember that you are asked not to park or get out of your car when in the Kiss 'n Ride line up. The Kiss 'n Ride is exactly that - a quick kiss as your child(ren) quickly get out of the family car. Or the quick ability for your child(ren) to get into the car and do up their own seatbelts. Please ensure that you have pulled up to the front of the line prior to your child(ren) getting out of the car.

After school, staff will support students by getting them to their car safely. If you need to help your child(ren) get in and out of the car, or to assist with the seatbelt, or to help with the putting on or taking off of backpacks, we kindly ask that you park your car in a designated parking spot - away from the flow of traffic.

Our parking lot is small, however the traffic is able to flow well when expectations are followed. We thank everyone for their cooperation when it comes to the safety of our students and staff when in the parking lot and in the Kiss 'n Ride.

Bussing Information From Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS)

Please visit www.nsts.ca and sign-in to the secure parent portal to get your child's student transportation information. To sign in to the portal you will need your child's Ontario Education Number (OEN)



which can be found on their report card. While you are there, <u>please subscribe to the delay and cancellation module for direct and timely emails regarding student transportation that impacts your child.</u>

Remember Bus guidelines...

Be 5 to 10 minutes early and stand on the inside of the sidewalk/shoulder away from the roadway.

<u>When the bus arrives</u> line up in a straight line, wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and the doors to open, and never touch the outside of the bus.

<u>Getting on the bus</u> one at a time, hold the handrail as you climb the stairs, and go directly to your seat and get settled.

<u>Riding on the bus</u> sit with your back to the back of the seat and your bottom to the bottom of your seat with your school bag on your lap and use your quiet speaking voice so that the bus driver can concentrate on driving.

<u>Getting off the bus</u> stay in your seat until the bus comes to a complete stop, only get off the bus at your school or at your bus stop, look for your parent/guardian before you get off the bus if that is your routine, and always tell the bus drive if you do not see your parent/guardian at the bus stop waiting for you if that is your routine or if you missed the stop.

<u>Crossing in front of the bus.</u> Watch and wait for the bus driver to signal to you to cross the road once it is safe to do so.

PPM 128: Cell Phone Use in Schools

Tigers - Sports Corner

Dear Parents of Students in Grade 4 - 8,

This year, and every year hence forth, we are asking parents to sign off on the NCDSB Elementary Participation/Acknowledgment of risk form before any interschool sport can be played. This would include all sports and intramurals.



Intramural activities are defined as school-sponsored physical/recreation activities that occur outside the student's instructional time and are not competitions against other outside teams/groups. They may include Sports Games and Sport Imitations, Low Organization Activities, Drop-In Physical Activities, and some Special Events and Clubs.

Elements of Risk: In all physical activities there is an element of risk. Accidents/injuries may result from the nature of the activity and can occur without any fault on either the part of the student, or the school board or its employees or agents or the facility where the activity is taking place. Injuries may range from minor sprains and strains to more serious injuries (for example, concussion). Participants assume this risk but reduce the chance of an accident/injury occurring by carefully following instructions at all times during the activity.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation (Orange Shirt Day): September 30th

Orange Shirt Day is the story of Phyllis Webstad, an Indigenous woman who shared her experience at an Indian Residential School through the children's book, The Orange Shirt Story. By participating in Orange Shirt Day, we recognize the harm done to generations of



children by the Indian Residential School system in Canada. The first Orange Shirt Day occurred on September 30th, 2013 as Chief Fred Robbins saw Phyllis' story as a way of bringing together Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. Since that time, Orange Shirt Day has grown into a national awareness among schools, businesses, and communities. In June 2021, the Federal Government of Canada designated September 30th as the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation. While this addresses Call to Action #80 of the Truth and Reconciliations 94 Calls to Action, it coincides with an established day that was created by Survivors of Indian Residential Schools. As a Board we can acknowledge the Federal statutory day, but for school and student activities, for the present time, it remains "Orange Shirt Day" as a way of respecting the grass root Indigenous movement.

Throughout the month of September, staff will be explaining to students the meaning of Orange Shirt Day at a level appropriate for their student's understanding. Please help to recognize this day by wearing an orange shirt.

This is not an out of dress code day. Dress code bottoms are to be worn with an orange shirt.

Elementary Dress Code

NCDSB has a dress code of <u>navy and white</u> for all Elementary schools and their students within. Below is an excerpt from the Elementary Standardized Dress-Code Policy 302.6.10:



1.1 At a minimum, every student is required to wear one of the

following items:
Navy Blue sweat pants for students in Kindergarten to Grade 3;
Navy Blue Pants (Cargo, Corduroy, Denim, Dress, Kobe styles permitted);
Navy Blue Dresses or Skorts; or
Navy Blue Capris or Walking Shorts.
Grade 8 students have the option to wear grey secondary uniform pants purchased through Board uniform suppliers. Pants, skirt or dress length must be appropriate and modest. Only knee length capris or shorts are permitted. All clothing must be in good repair.

1.2 At a minimum, every student is required to wear one of the following items:

Navy Blue or White Oxford shirt (short or long sleeve);

Navy Blue or White Polo shirt (short or long sleeve); or

School designed spirit wear polo shirt. The elementary standardized dress code shirts, either polo or oxford must be buttoned in a respectable manner. Visible t-shirts worn under the elementary standardized dress code top must be either navy blue or white. In addition, approved sweaters and hoodies embroidered and/or screened with the school logo are permitted to be worn as part of the elementary standardized dress code.

Anaphylaxis Awareness

All schools within Niagara Catholic are peanut and tree nut free. At St. Nicholas Catholic, we have many students with a life threatening allergy (anaphylaxis) to peanut and/or tree nut products. We ask that you please read labels carefully ensuring that all lunch products are peanut and tree nut free. That includes products that

'may contain' or are packaged in a facility that uses peanuts and/or tree nuts. For more information on anaphylaxis, visit www.anaphylaxis.ca. We work very hard at preventing accidental exposure. We ask that you please ensure that your child has thoroughly washed his or her hands after eating peanuts or peanut products for breakfast while at home. It is also very important that we have common rules throughout the school. The teachers will explain the importance of the following health and safety routines to the students in their classrooms: 1) Wash hands with soap and water/hand sanitizer before and after eating, 2) Do not bring in food that contains, or possibly contains peanuts/tree nuts 3) Do not share food with other students 4) Do not accept food from other students, especially if you have an allergy 5) Dispose of all food waste properly If your child has an allergy or is anaphylactic, please ensure that the office is aware and that the proper medical forms have been completed. All medication signed off on by a doctor will be housed safely at the school during the duration of the school year. Please check the expiration date of all medication prior to bringing in.

Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools

Ryan's Law (Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools) 2015 is an important step to support the health and well-being of students diagnosed with asthma in Ontario schools.



If your son/daughter has been diagnosed with asthma, please contact the office to provide information about your son/daughter's asthma medication.

You will be required to complete and submit the Niagara Catholic Student Asthma Management Plan for your student.

Any student under the age of 16 years will be permitted to carry and administer his/her asthma medication at school with your consent. A student 16 years or older is not required to have his or her parent's or guardian's permission to carry his or her asthma medication.

Rowan's Law: Concussion Safety

September 30, 2025, is Rowan's Law Day. The last Wednesday of every September is designated as Rowan's Law Day to honour



Rowan Stringer's memory and raise awareness about concussion safety. In May 2013, 17-year-old Rowan died as the result of head injuries she sustained while playing rugby.

As a result, Rowan's Law requires all coaches and team trainers to review their sport organization's Concussion Code of Conduct each year before the start of the season. The code sets out expectations and rules of behaviour to minimize concussions while playing sport. NCDSB has a concussion protocol in place that schools review yearly. And although we try to minimize accidents through proactive safety and diligence, sometimes injuries do happen.
